- Staff will meet with a parent group at Bailey's Crossroads Elementary School on December 5, 2013, to share information about maintenance and repair issues in rental dwellings. Material prepared by the Commission will be distributed.
- The next meeting of the <u>Residential Studios Committee</u> is December 9, 2013. The proposed Zoning Ordinance amendments are being evaluated. All meetings are open to the public.
- A summary of two closed cases mediated by staff was presented. One case involved a tenant's dissatisfaction that a Pay or Quit notice was issued by the landlord after the rent was paid. The other complaint involved a security deposit dispute between a tenant who rented a room without permission of the landlord to another tenant. Mediation efforts were not successful. The case proceeded to the Fairfax County General District Court where the tenant who rented the room was awarded their security deposit plus court costs.

- Chair Gomez requested a presentation regarding the county's FY 2015 budget. Staff will update the Commission as the budget process proceeds.
