e-Prosecutor Case Management System

The Office of the Commonwealth's Attorney (CWA), in collaboration with the Fairfax County Department of Information Technology and Court Technology Office, has implemented a Commercial-Off-The-Shelf (COTS) case management system with a secure, scalable multi-user platform compliant with the County's Enterprise and Strategic IT Plan. The new system automates, integrates and upgrades existing processes and functions handled by the CWA and supporting staff. Under Virginia law, the Commonwealth's Attorney is the chief law enforcement officer of their respective jurisdiction. The primary mission of the CWA is to review and prosecute all felony cases, domestic violence cases, and misdemeanor cases and to provide legal training and advice to police officers, magistrates, and other local officials.

The CWA previously relied on an antiquated case management client server system built with an obsolete Paradox backend. The prior system was no longer supported and was out of compliance with Fairfax County IT Security standards and protocols. The previous system only captured a fraction of the data and information needed by the CWA, and data was at significant risk due to inadequate back-up and recovery capabilities. A new case management solution, eProsecutor, has been implemented to address these concerns and provide additional functionality. The solution is a County compliant web-based application developed on a Java Enterprise Edition (JEE) platform, an industry standard. The CWA has a very high case volume and attorney case and courtroom scheduling is a very complex and labor-intensive process. The eProsecutor solution replaces the existing case management system, streamlines and automates existing manual processes, and improves efficiencies with Law Enforcement agencies and the courts.

The e-Prosecutor solution meets the primary objectives to improve citizens' access to the Courts, facilitate trials and hearings in the most effective and efficient means possible, allow for all three Courts to share common resources, and provide for flexibility and adaptability to incorporate future changes in technology and court proceedings.
