Nearly 40 percent of Fairfax County's emissions come from on-road vehicles like cars and trucks. Other forms of transportation reduce these emissions and can also save you money, help the local air quality, and add variety to your routine.





Fairfax County has **13 Metrorail stations** that take tens of thousands of riders all across the county and the greater DC area each year.

Fairfax County Commuter Services offers some incentives or reward programs for **local carpools and rideshares**. Plus, carpoolers can share fuel costs, reduce emissions, and take turns driving to reduce maintenance bills.



There are many sidewalks, trails, and bike routes throughout the county that are suitable for all ages and abilities, plus an interactive bike map to get you where you need to go.



The Fairfax Connector bus system has more than **90 routes**, including connections at transportation, shopping, and community hubs.



Many of the county's trails are shared between people walking, biking, riding, and rolling. Even 10 minutes of brisk activity can improve your physical health! 1
