

### Supplement Requested FY 2016

- Clerk's Office is "face" of Fairfax County courthouse
- Extensive public service to citizens
- Collect revenue on behalf of County
- Support County initiatives
  - Diversion First
  - Mental Health Docket
  - Veterans Treatment Docket
- Salaries not competitive, turnover high



# Board of Supervisors Award in FY 2017

- Assist with employee retention
- Provide more equitable compensation
- Provide comparable salaries to surrounding jurisdictions
- Improves service delivery
- Reduces the risk that citizens' civil liberties will be impacted



#### Results: Workforce Data

- Salaries comparable to most surrounding jurisdictions (15%)
- Since implementation
  - 80% reduction in staff going to surrounding jurisdictions
  - 13 trained staff recruited from surrounding jurisdictions and supplement was a factor
  - Resignation rate down 18%
  - Improved retention for employees with less than 1 year of service

6% increase in new cases filed from FY 2018 to FY 2019 315,048 Total cases

7% increase in Traffic cases (15,469 more cases) 9% increase in Civil Cases (4,586 more cases)



### Improves Service Delivery

New Initiative: Expedited review hearings (19.2-169)

- 86% reduction in jail cost for typical case
- Jail cost avoidance of \$24K for typical case
- Typical mental health cases heard in 14 days vs. 120 days

Improves access to treatment

Better chance of maintaining employment

New Initiative: Supervised Release Violation Docket (Diversion First)

- Criminal Show Cause filings increased 40% in 2018 compared to previous year
- Compared to 4% decrease statewide


# Improves Service Delivery


#### Garnishment processing time down 92%

- 2016 to 2018
- Was 180 days, down to 14 days
- Better chance of recovering on judgment

#### Writ of Eviction processing time down 90%

- 2017 to 2018
- Was 21 days, down to 2 days
