The meeting was called to order at 7:34 p.m. by Chairman Fielding.

#### Minutes

A motion was made by Commissioner Geier-Smith and seconded by Commissioner Harberg to approve the minutes from April 18, 2019. The motion carried unanimously.

## Report of the Chairman

Chairman Fielding acknowledged Leah Meyer who attended the meeting as an observer.

Chairman Fielding stated that the application by Comstock Herndon Venture, LC, for its redevelopment project in Herndon's downtown, was recently approved. Currently, the plan does not set aside affordable housing units.

# Report of the Directors

Director Liberman did not have a report.

#### Staff Report

A case was summarized regarding a tenant who alleged their landlord did not promptly remediate a mold issue in the tenant's apartment. The tenant obtained a professional assessment, which confirmed the presence of mold. After the tenant filed a complaint with Consumer Affairs, the landlord contacted the tenant and agreed to remediate the mold. The tenant was satisfied with the landlord's response and requested no further intervention from Consumer Affairs.

Commissioners discussed the impact of mold in rental housing. There was discussion regarding actions needed to reduce the emotional response to mold and how landlords are addressing and remediating mold in rental housing.
