2016 BOND PROCESS

Now through Fall 2016

- Continue to refine project list by late April/early May
- BOS authorizes bond amount with budget process
- Conduct Public Outreach/Communication Plan/Establish Green Team - Spring
- Provide Category Allocations by June
- Prepare ballot question and get approvals June
- Support Green Team
- VOTE!
- Celebrate a well earned win!



2016 Park Bond Project List – Still a Work in Progress

- November \$238M List of projects sorted by priority
 - How are priorities determined?
 - Lifecycle schedules, condition assessments (user/customer service expectations/ modernization, operational efficiencies) stakeholder/user input, deferred projects, phased projects, needs assessment, patrons served, revenue enhancements, systems analysis, social equity
- December \$109M reduced list based on PAB and leadership input
 - Deferred many projects
 - Reduced Funding allocations to do less



Jan – More refinements based on Leadership and PAB/BOS input - \$92M

- Reduce total to authorized bond amount
- Shovel ready/Priority and revenue projects proposed for bond premium funding
- Deferred some renovations
- Added BOS priority projects
- Listed Countywide grouped projects by districts
- Partnerships Opportunity consideration
- Project list still reflects systemwide priorities
- Project list still a draft WORK IN PROGRESS



RECenters – Protecting Revenue Production

- Mt Vernon highest priority Market and feasibility study results to be presented in March with project recommendations
- RECenter System Study Proposed bond premium project to examine systemwide RECenter markets to tailor offerings/program space appropriately and inform future RECenter improvements
- Project list includes funding for critical lifecycle renovations until scheduled major renovations/upgrades
- Project list includes funding to advance design for future improvements at Audrey Moore RECenter
- Energy Management Upgrades
