

ACTION

<u>Great Falls Nike Park – Mastenbrook Volunteer Matching Fund Grant Program Request – Great Falls Soccer Club (Dranesville District)</u>

ISSUE:

Approval of a Mastenbrook Volunteer Matching Fund Grant Program request from Great Falls Soccer Club in the amount of \$20,000 to convert field 7 to synthetic turf at Great Falls Nike Park.

RECOMMENDATION:

The Park Authority Director recommends approval of the Mastenbrook Volunteer Matching Fund Grant Program request from Great Falls Soccer Club in the amount of \$20,000 to convert field 7 to synthetic turf at Great Falls Nike Park.

TIMING:

Board action is requested on April 26, 2017, in order to award the grant.

BACKGROUND:

On February 22, 2017, the Park Authority Board approved a Use Agreement with the Great Falls Soccer Club for the conversion of field 7 at Great Falls Nike Park (Attachment 1) to synthetic Turf. Field 7 is currently an unlighted Bermudagrass rectangle field that is shown as lighted on the Park's Master Plan.

GFSC is requesting \$20,000 from the Mastenbrook Volunteer Matching Fund Grants Program to help fund the completion of the project (Attachment 2). If approved, the \$20,000 from the Mastenbrook Volunteer Matching Fund Grants Program, along with an \$855,000 contribution from the GFSC, \$125,000 from the Neighborhood and Community Services Synthetic Turf Development Mini-Grant Program, and \$250,000 from the 2012 Park Bond, will provide the funds sufficient to complete the project. The total project budget is \$1,250,000.

GFSC has been a participant in the Adopt-A-Field program for several years, and over the years has contributed funds towards maintenance and athletic field improvements for fields at Great Falls Nike Park as well as many other park and school athletic fields. Board Agenda Item April 26, 2017

The Park Authority Board Member for the Dranesville District supports approval of the Grant request. Staff from Planning and Development will manage the project, which is scheduled for completion in the summer of 2017. Matching funds are available to complete this project.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The estimated total project cost is \$1,250,000. Funds are currently available in the amount of \$20,000 in WBS PR-000009, Community Parks/New Facilities-2012, in Fund 300-C30400, Park Authority Bond Construction; \$250,000 in PR-000005-052, Park and Building Renovations, Fund 300-C30400 Park Authority Bond Construction; \$125,000 in PR-000080, Athletic Services Fee – Turf Development Fund, in Fund 300-C30010, County Construction Fund; and \$855,000 from GFSC, resulting in the total available funding of \$1,250,000.

Contingent on the approval of this project, the remaining balance in the Mastenbrook Volunteer Matching Fund Grant Program will be \$86,562.61.



(2) Proposal Narrative

Great Falls Soccer Club is part of Virginia Youth Soccer Association. Our program aims to provide a wholesome, well-organized environment in which we teach soccer skills, teamwork, and good sportsmanship, as well as contribute to the general health and social well-being of all participants in accordance with the GFSC bylaws.

Our Little Kickers program is designed for our youngest players (most 3 year olds). Our Big Kickers program is designed for slightly older players (older 3s and 4 year olds), the year before they enter our House league, to prepare them for this transition.

The GFSC House program, or recreational league, is a developmental program designed for players, ages 4 through 19, who are still developing the technical skills to play soccer or do not have the interest in playing soccer at a highly competitive level.

The GFSC Travel program is for those kids who have sufficient skill and interest to play soccer at more competitive levels. Tryouts are held for the GFSC travel teams annually in late May through mid June (sometimes in other months of the year if the roster is not full).

We offer league play in the Fall and Spring Seasons and offer training and developmental camps and clinics in the Winter and Summer. There are opportunities to play soccer 11-12 months of the year (or season by season for recreational players).

Great Falls Soccer Club has grown in the past five years from 853 to 1,039 youth members (this excludes the proximate 30 adult members we have over the years). This represents an overall growth of 186 members or 22% over the past five years and an average steady growth in excess of 5% per year. During these years of growth we have seen no significant increase in allocated number of fields – instead we have focused on obtaining a higher use out of each field. We worked together with Fairfax County to install added goals on Baron Cameron 7 and Nike 7 to create small sided fields (Baron Cameron 7A and 7B, Nike 7A and 7B).

Due to the higher intensity of use on each field we have also seen more wear and tear on the fields which in turn leads to higher maintenance costs in order to keep the fields in good playing condition. Our club installed bermuda grass on Nike 7 many years ago and developed the field into its premier flagship field and forms the "iconic hart" of the Great Falls Soccer Club community. Nike 7 is centrally located within the Great Falls community and is in an area of great need.

The bermuda grass on Nike 7 has seen tremendous stress this past season due to increased play time as well as negative weather conditions such as excessive cold weather late into the season and excessive amounts of rainfall during the spring.

Over the past decade Great Falls Soccer Club has maintained 8 fields under the adoption program with Fairfax County. These fields include: Nike 7, 8, The Grange, Lockmeade, Grand Hampton, Baron Cameron

7, 8 and 10. We on average invest close to \$80,000 per year in mowing, lining and maintaining these fields under our adoption program. Nike 7 however being a bermuda grass field and our flagship field typically runs \$15,000/year in costs for mowing, lining and maintenance.

Although GFSC has adopted both Nike 8 and The Grange it is only able to use these fields in the Spring or Fall Season due to sharing requirements with LAX/Hockey and Little League Baseball respectively.

GFSC is looking to develop Nike 7 into a synthetic turf field that includes lighting. The Master Plan allows Nike 7 to be a lighted field. Nike 7 is part of the Great Falls Nike Park located at the northeast corner of Route 7 and Utterback Store Road immediately adjacent to Forestville Elementary School in Great Falls. Great Falls Nike Park consists of 8 sports fields – 5 of which are baseball fields (Nike #1, 2, 3, 5, and 6) and 3 rectangular fields (Nike #4, 7, and 8). The Nike Field Complex benefits from great accessibility off Route 7. Adequate parking is available to support the athletic fields.

Soccer is an ever more popular and growing sport in the US. Due to the strong board leadership and highly talented coaching staff GFSC has seen growing interest from members in our program. As outlined prior our club has been steadily growing in numbers and is anticipated to retain its growth path in the years to come.

Our club and community is in great need of more playing time on a centrally located synthetic turf field. Nike 7 as a synthetic field will not only further bolster our clubs' flagship field within this central location of our community but perhaps more importantly provide much needed additional usage and less down time due to weather impacts.

Several years ago Great Falls Lacrosse/Field Hockey was able to work together with Fairfax County to develop Nike 4 as a synthetic turf field. GFLAX with approximately 500 members has benefitted significantly from turfing this field. Nike 4 allows for other sports beside LAX including field hockey, soccer and rugby and football. Nike 4 has lighting to maximize use of the field. GFSC is able to use Nike 4 for some limited time of the playing season.

Similar to Nike 4 GFSC anticipates a very similar setup and size (360' x 210') to Nike 4 in terms of its design features as well as its multi-sport and community use. It is our intent to incorporate lighting into Nike 7 such that use of the field can be maximized. As stated prior the Master Plan for Nike Park already allows Nike 7 to be lighted.

The larger size field (360' x 210') which is the same as Nike 4 can provide for full sized field play as well as small sided field play. The new facility would have bleachers and team benches. The current Nike 7 field has fencing along Route 7 and Utterback Store Road.

It is our understanding that both Great Falls LAX/Field Hockey as well as Great Falls Little League would support developing Nike 7 from a bermuda grass field into a synthetic turf field. We believe that this would support the wider community in its needs and activities.
