ACTION

Approval of Friends Group Policy

ISSUE:

Approval of Friends Group policy to ensure all Park Authority Friends Groups are protected and to provide the requirements for new Friends Groups.

RECOMMENDATION:

The Park Authority Executive Director recommends approval of the Friends Group Policy 407.

TIMING:

Board action is requested on February 28, 2018.

BACKGROUND:

The Friends Group Project was initiated for the purposes of ensuring Friends Groups are protected and to help new Friends Groups get started. Over the last year, staff has worked to develop several deliverables which include: a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU), Park Authority Board Policy, a comprehensive Friends Handbook, a new Park Volunteer Team (PVT) Program, and the Friends Capacity Building Fund. Over the course of the project, staff held four Federation of Friends meetings, numerous individual meetings with specific Friends Groups, and three Taskforce meetings with Friends Groups representatives. Through this process, the MOU and policy went through multiple revisions with input from staff and Friends Groups. The Park Volunteer Team (PVT) Program and a Friends Capacity Building Fund were developed in response to Friends Groups' feedback during outreach and review sessions. Questions on the legal risks and insurance coverage were researched and communicated to the Friends Groups. In the fall of 2017 the Taskforce revised the Policy and MOU and developed the final versions. Those documents were presented to all Friends Groups through the project web page, and at the Federation of Friends meeting on January 26, 2018, without objection.

The new Friends Policy provides the fundamental requirements for all Park Authority Friends groups to ensure the groups are protected.

- Possible stepping stone to a Friends Group




Friends Capacity Building Fund

- Provides funding for Friends Groups' projects, programs, and other initiatives that further the missions of the Friends Group, the Site/Program, and the Park Authority
- Provides a benefit to being a Friends Group
- Provide tools for new friends groups to form and a way to support existing friends groups
- Helps ensure that Friends Groups will be protected

Purpose: Friends Groups provide great value and benefit to specific parks, facilities, agency-wide programs and, thus, the entire park system. This policy establishes a definition of Friends Groups and a framework for the partnership between the Friends Groups and the Fairfax County Park Authority.

Policy Statement: Friends Groups are community-led, independent organizations who may support, educate, advocate, and/or fundraise for a park, facility, or program. The Park Authority welcomes and applauds partnerships with and contributions from Friends Groups. The partnership promotes a cooperative working relationship between the Friends Groups and Park Authority Board members and/or staff in order to represent the community's views. The partnership also promotes coordination between the Friends Groups and Park Authority staff to offer services to the community and improve parks and services.

The Park Authority is entrusted to protect the public's land, offer park facilities and services for public use, and assist those who contribute to this mission. The Park Authority encourages Friends Groups to form, grow, and support parks, facilities, and programs. The Park Authority may grant Friends Groups permission to use park names, provide services, and conduct business on parkland. The Park Authority is committed to providing resources to Friends Groups to help them advance their missions.

To ensure good will between the local community and the parks and to protect the Friends Groups Board, members, and volunteers, Friends Groups will incorporate; hold a signed and current Friends Group Memorandum of Understanding; register as a non-profit organization; maintain their own insurance coverage; and meet state and local charitable solicitation requirements.
