ADMIN-1 <u>Adoption of Minutes – January 23, 2019 Park Authority Board Meeting</u> Mr. Quincy made a motion to adopt the minutes of the January 23, 2019, Park Authority board meeting; seconded by Mr. Thompson. The motion carried by all members present; Dr. Aidoo was absent.

CHAIRMAN'S MATTERS

- Budget hearings will take place in April and Parks will emphasize a number of different things. The topics will be run past the board for its input to ensure nothing has been missed.
- The Calendar of Events will no longer be printed. Subscriptions are currently being taken. There are about 9,000 people Parks reaches out to regularly.
- Bill received an invitation to the 25th Anniversary luncheon of the Northern Virginia Conservation Trust. He is unable to attend so he extended his invitation to attend. It will be held on March 21 at 11:30 a.m. at the Key Bridge Marriott.

DIRECTOR'S MATTERS

- Kirk Kincannon noted that he will be attending the Northern Virginia Conservation Trust event, so if anyone is attending, they could sit together.
- The Fairfax County Park Authority joined with <u>America's State Parks</u> and <u>Virginia State</u> <u>Parks First Day Hike Programs</u> for the third annual First Hike Fairfax on January 1. The program promotes highlighted family-friendly and popular starter hikes in parks across Fairfax County and kicks off the Park Authority's <u>Healthy Strides 12 Steps for a Healthier</u> <u>2019</u>.

Over 280 pictures from hikers that captured the essence of our parks were submitted for the photo contest. With more than 1,200 votes cast for the finalists, Diane Willen's sunrise photo of Burke Lake Park was named the People's Choice Winner. Brian W. Knight was named the Judges' Choice Winner. Judges felt that his photo of fiancée Christy Wahle striking a pose at Scott's Run Nature Preserve perfectly captured the spirit of the annual First Hike initiative.

Winners received a top prize of a free four-month <u>RECenter pass</u> and everyone who submitted photos each received two free RECenter guest passes along with <u>RECenter pass</u> sale information.

- Mr. Kendall noted that the Park Authority is launching On the Beadin' Path in Mason District. A kick-off event will be held on Saturday, March 16, 2019 at 11 a.m. at Mason District Park. The kickoff activities will be held at the Mason District Park farmers' market on Thursday, May 2, 2019 from 9 a.m. to noon. The program runs through August 19, 2019.

He noted that more information on the program was forwarded to the board on his behalf.

- Mr. Stone announced that he will speak at the budget hearings with a specific ask to the Board of Supervisors. His speaking points have not been written yet, but he sat down with several people from Park Authority staff and talked about how the Resource Management Division is funded by Parks, and give us some opportunity to get money. The county has a stormwater fund that is used for a reforestation program and they claim that this a good way to save money on green infrastructure and prevents erosion and runoff. Parks clearly has more trees than the county does. He feels that Parks should be getting some of that funding. He is working with staff to make a little more cogent argument. He indicated that he wanted to get the idea out there so if anyone had any thoughts on the topic before he speaks on April 11.
