



# What Can We Recycle?

## Mixed Paper & Cardboard

County code **requires** that non-residential properties recycle mixed paper and cardboard. This includes office paper, catalogs, magazines, junk mail, cardboard (flattened), newspapers, paper grocery bags, and cereal boxes.

## Additional Requirements for Certain Businesses

If your business meets any ONE of the following criteria, you must recycle one **Principle Recyclable Material (PRM)** *in addition* to mixed paper and cardboard.

- An annual total waste stream of 100 tons or more from a single non-residential entity; or
- An annual combined waste stream of 100 or more from a complex or institution; or
- An annual average occupancy of 200 persons or more at a non-residential facility.

If any of the above applies to your property, you must provide a system for your tenants to recycle at least one PRM *in addition* to mixed paper and cardboard.

Business Type	Typical PRM
Retail Store	Mixed Paper/Cardboard
Auto Repair Shop	Scrap Metal/Used Motor Oil
Restaurant, Gym	Bottles & Cans; Glass
Office Building	Office Paper
Landscaping Company	Leaves, Grass, or Brush

A PRM is the recyclable material that constitutes the majority of the facility's recyclables waste stream. **If the PRM for your facility is mixed paper & cardboard, then no additional recycling is required.**
