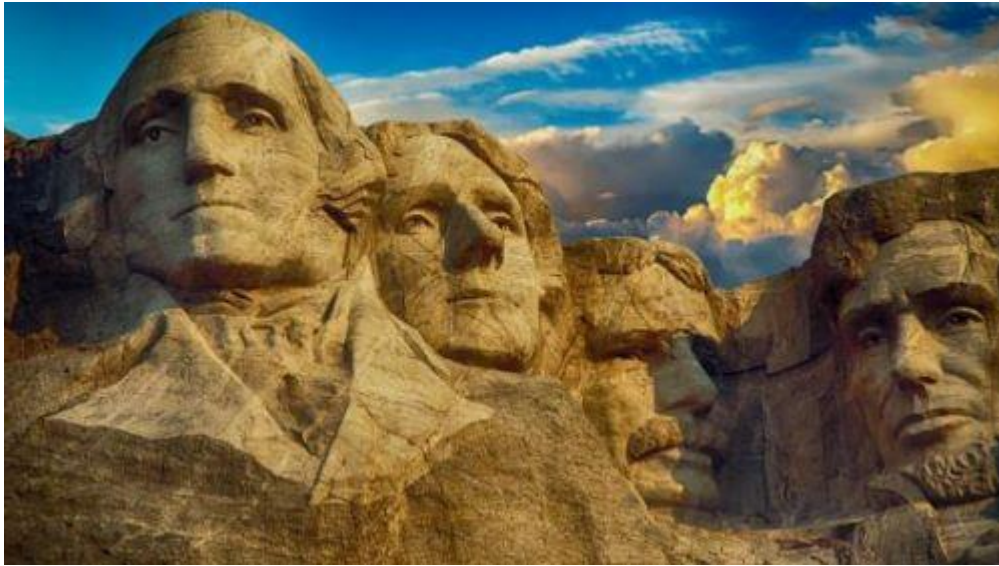

2019 REVIVE! Training Classes



REVIVE! trains individuals on what to do and not do in an overdose situation, how to administer naloxone, and what to do afterwards. Each attendee also receives a free REVIVE! kit, which includes all the supplies needed to administer naloxone. The medication itself can be acquired at a pharmacy after completing the training. Attendees also receive a safety plan to help individuals prevent overdose if they relapse.

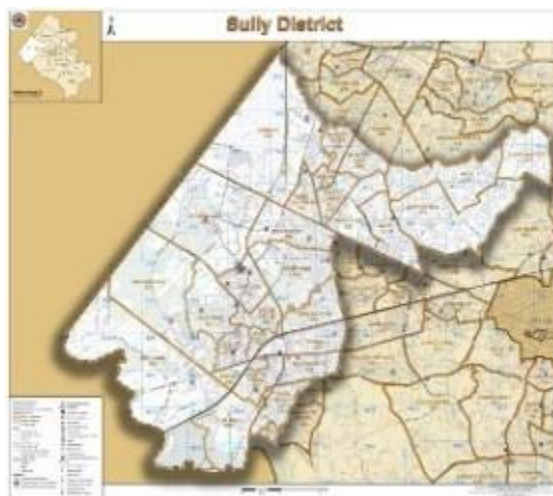

College Scholarship for Criminal Justice Majors



Are you enrolled at a Virginia college or university? Are you majoring in a criminal justice field? And are you a resident of Fairfax County, the City of Fairfax, the Town of Herndon, or the Town of Vienna? If you answered "yes" to these three questions, then you may be eligible to apply for a college scholarship from the Virginia Sheriffs' Institute (VSI) Scholarship Program through the Fairfax County Sheriff's Office. Scholarships are available to both full and part-time students.

How to Get Started:

- Please review the [scholarship eligibility criteria and application checklist](#).

- As you fill out the application, please email [Kelly Hartle](#) at the Sheriff's Office **no later than April 5, 2019** to schedule a meeting with Sheriff Kincaid regarding the letter of recommendation to go with your application. You will be asked to provide information about your school and extra-curricular activities/achievements prior to the scheduled meeting.
- Once you speak with Sheriff Kincaid and receive your letter of recommendation, include it with your application.
- The application and required attachments must be at the Virginia Sheriffs' Institute **by May 1, 2019**.

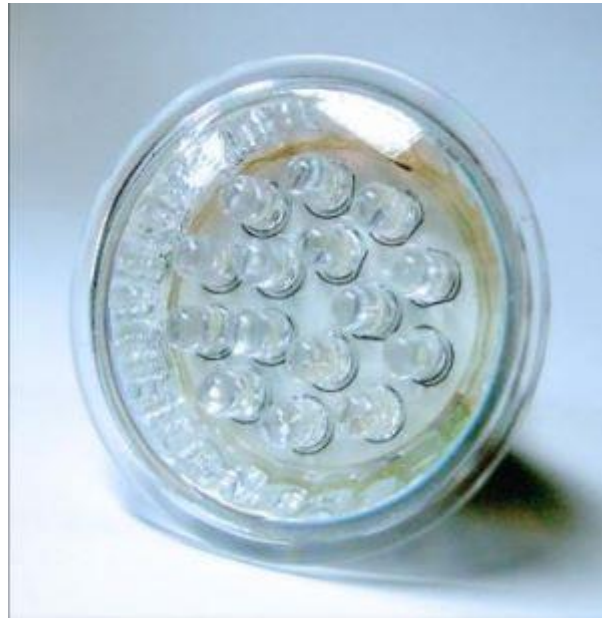

Fairfax County Energy Initiatives

As part of the *FY 2018 Carryover Review*, funding in the amount of \$4.5 million was approved to support Fairfax County's Operational Energy Strategy. The Energy Strategy was adopted by the Board on July 10, 2018, and includes plans to move the County forward toward its goal of reducing energy use by 20 percent by 2029. The funding provides for the first-year investment in the Operational Energy Strategy and includes lighting retrofit projects throughout the County.

The 10-year investment for this goal is approximately \$48 million; however, by year 7, savings generated by the investment will essentially pay for the projects. The

projected annual energy savings are 264 million kBtu.

LED Lighting Retrofit Projects in the Sully District:

- **Sully Governmental Center** - The project is estimated to be completed in the Winter of 2019.
- **Poplar Tree Fields 1, 2** - The project is estimated to be completed in the Spring of 2019.
