Join Delegate Karrie Delaney and Sully District Supervisor Kathy Smith on September 7, 2019 for a [DMV 2 Go event](#)! This event will allow you to access all the services of the [Department of Motor Vehicles](#) (DMV) without the long lines.

This is the perfect time to skip the long DMV lines and get your REAL ID before they are required in airports. Beginning October 1, 2020, Virginians will need a REAL ID compliant driver's license or ID card, or another federally approved form of identification (Example: U.S. passport or some military IDs), to board domestic flights or enter secure federal facilities.

All applicants for a REAL ID compliant credential must apply in-person and pay a \$10 one-time REAL ID surcharge in addition to the standard renewal or replacement fees. For more information about how to apply for a REAL ID, [click here](#).

Expanded Vital Records Services Offered at Additional Office Locations



Certified copies of Virginia birth, death, marriage, and divorce records are now available for purchase from the Fairfax County Health Department at [four district locations](#).

By expanding its [Vital Records](#) services, the Health Department will now offer records for these life events occurring in the Commonwealth of Virginia:

- Births: June 1912 to present
- Marriages: 1936 to present
- Divorces: 1918 to present
- Deaths: June 1912 to present

Fairfax County Partners with Smart City Works & Refraction on Initiative



Fairfax County partnered with Smart City Works and Refraction on their [successful application for a \\$750,000 federal grant](#) to increase regional capacity to bring technologies to market and grow innovative companies.

The grant is from the i6 Challenge program from the U.S. Dept. of Commerce's Economic Development Administration. This investment advances the county's and region's efforts to drive innovation, spur entrepreneurship, and grow emerging high-growth companies and the technology workforce.

With the i6 Challenge grant, Smart City Works and Refraction will lead the Northern Virginia Smart City Initiative to:

- Accelerate the development and lower the risk profile of companies seeking to provide innovative solutions to infrastructure challenges.
- Grow the number of startups and highly skilled tech talent in the region.
- Accelerate the commercialization of innovative products.
- Strengthen the regional smart city cluster supporting innovation, entrepreneurship, and commercialization.

As a result of this initiative, the two organizations expect to support and mentor 85 companies that will create more than 180 jobs over the next five years.

Scholarships Offered for Park Authority Classes

Fairfax County residents who meet the requirements listed below are eligible to take one coded class per quarter. There is a \$15 processing fee for each scholarship class that is refundable only if Fairfax County cancels the program. No scholarships are offered for camps, workshops, day trips and tours, programs offered by private vendors, FallProof, Gravity, or Pilates lessons. Supply fees must be paid by student.

Public Assistance Recipients:

Parents/Guardians are eligible to register each dependent family member that receives public assistance for one coded class per quarter. A verification letter from the agency providing assistance must be provided and include eligibility dates and the name of the dependent who will receive the scholarship. Acceptable forms of public assistance include:

- Medicaid
- Free school lunch
- SNAP (food stamps)
- TANF

Senior Adults and Adults with Disabilities:

A scholarship of one class per quarter is offered for senior adults and adults with disabilities who certify that their income is below the [guidelines](#).

Video: Fair Woods Constructed Wetlands Project

The Fair Woods basin is very fair these days, with bursting blossoms and a bounty of birds and bugs. The constructed wetlands project was completed a few years ago to treat stormwater runoff and protect the Chesapeake Bay. The formerly unattractive mudhole off Route 50 has been transformed into a thriving natural area that meets regulatory requirements and removes phosphorous, nitrogen, and sediment from stormwater runoff.
