1. Public Hearing -Review of City of Falls Church Water System

Kirk Randall made comments to the commission.

Susan Hafeli, Utility Analyst, Public Utilities Branch, presented the Review of City of Falls Church Water System. The slide presentation showed the Falls Church water system, water rate history, planned increases, April26 Board Directive, rationale for rate increases, compliance with principles, examples of questions, past capital improvements, planned capital improvements, consumer protection, and recommendations.

Recommendations:

Fix rates and charges for water service so that Fairfax County customers of the City's water system will not be charged rates and charges that exceed those of Fairfax Water, unless the City can demonstrate the need for higher rates and charges to the County's satisfaction; and

Establish Fairfax Water as the exclusive water service provider for all new development and redevelopment in Fairfax County, unless Fairfax Water determines that it is unable to furnish water service to a given location.

Commissioner Kirk made the motion to adopt the staff report entitled *Review of City of Falls Church Water System: Rates and Capital Improvements*.

Commissioner Martz seconded the motion.

A discussion ensued that the recommendation was the best deal for Fairfax County customers, current rates are unfair, possible regulatory fix, definition of land use law, on-going increases, lack of transparency by Falls Church, possible litigation, and Fairfax Water's ability to retrofit existing county customers.

Commissioner Hargraves recalled the motion. Commissioner Boyd seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.
