Overview

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Federal-/State-funded Medicaid waiver required for Day and Employment Services

 Demand for waivers greater than state funding provided



Local Day & Employment Services

Began in early 1990s

Funded through county budget

 Services provided through the Fairfax-Falls Church Community Services Board (CSB)



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Changes in Disability Services

- Increased graduation rates of students with disabilities
- Medicaid waiver redesign expanded eligibility to include developmental disabilities
- Program name change to Developmental Disabilities



2017 Board of Supervisors Budget Guidance

- Continue to analyze the impact of changes in developmental services
- Continue broad community collaboration
