Reduced Cost Rabies Clinic

Please bring your pet to the Sully District Government Center on Sunday for the Rabies Clinic. Cost is \$15.

Please note:

- Dogs, cats, and ferrets will be vaccinated at the clinic.
 - Dogs **MUST** be on leashes. Cats and ferrets **MUST** be in carriers.
 - All pets will receive a 1-year rabies vaccine. To obtain a 3-year vaccine, bring your pet's rabies certificate showing your dog's current rabies vaccination and expiration date.

- Only rabies certificates will be issued (no tags).
- The cost of each vaccination is \$15.00; cash and check only.
- 2016 County Dog Licenses will be sold at each clinic at an additional cost of \$10.00 each.

The Dulles Suburban Center Study is a land use planning study that will update recommendations for future land uses and development. The last Comprehensive review of land use recommendations occurred in 1993. The comprehensive planning study will assess current conditions and the planned land uses of approximately 5,000 acres of land that are adjacent to the Washington-Dulles International Airport along the Route 28 and Route 50 corridors. This study will not include Land Units A and B of the Dulles Suburban Center since they were the subject of a recently adopted land use study.

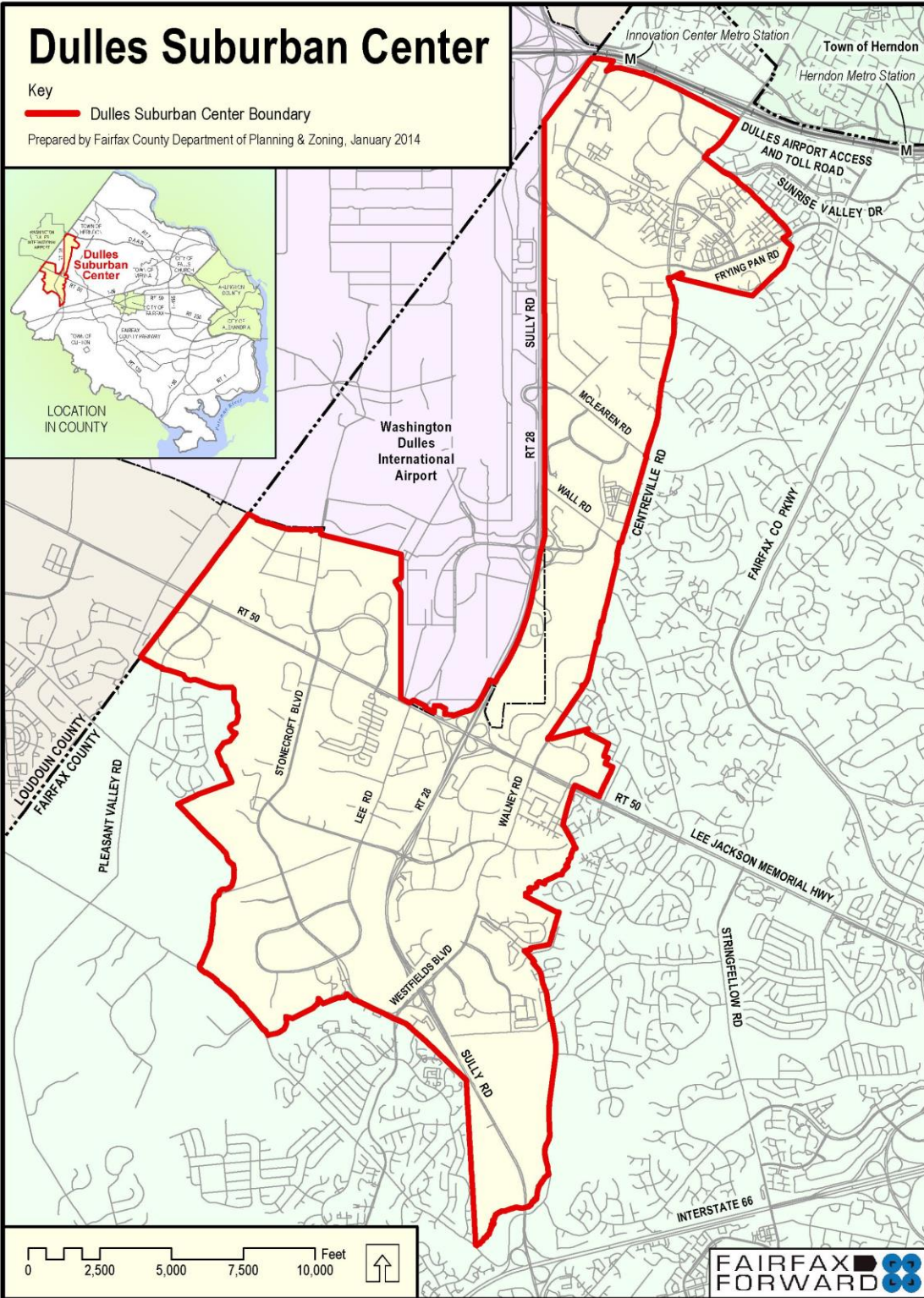
