# Update: Assistance for Individuals & Families Affected by the Federal Government Shutdown

# Federal Government Shutdown 2019

Thousands of federal workers, contractors, vendors, and service providers in our county are being impacted by the partial federal shutdown. It can be frightening and stressful to be without a paycheck and unsure of when you will go back to work. Whether it is food, financial assistance, or other needs, we can provide you with the resources to get you and your family through this difficult time.

#### How to Get Help:

We invite those in need to please contact <u>Coordinated Services Planning</u> at 703-222-0880, TTY 711, for assistance. Staff will help connect you to resources that can aid you during this time.

#### Assistance with Child Care:

- Child Care Assistance and Referral Program (CCAR) Families
   participating in the CCAR program have signed on with a 12-month
   eligibility. During this period, if you find yourself without income you can
   request that your child care co-payment be lowered. CCAR staff are
   available to speak with families to discuss their ongoing child care needs.

- School Age Child Care (SACC) Families impacted by the federal government shutdown may continue to use services and apply for a reduced fee and/or develop a payment plan as needed. Alternatively, families may request to be placed in a temporary inactive status, which allows the family to discontinue services temporarily while maintain their child's enrollment space in SACC. Call 703-449-8989 or email <a href="mailto:saccregistration@fairfaxcounty.gov">saccregistration@fairfaxcounty.gov</a> to discuss ongoing needs for before and after school child care with SACC staff.

#### Free Connector Bus Rides:

Beginning Thursday, January 17, 2019, Fairfax Connector will provide free rides <a href="mailto:system-wide">system-wide</a> for federal government employees affected by the government shutdown who are still required to report for work.

- You must show your federal photo ID to the bus operator when boarding to ride free.
- By showing your federal photo ID, trips taken on <u>all Fairfax Connector bus</u>
   <u>routes</u> are free, including express routes to and from the Pentagon and
   Downtown D.C.

#### Two Ways to Help Our Neighbors in Need:

- The county's <u>Stuff the Bus events</u> begin on Saturday, January 19. Bring your food and cash donations and help us support our local nonprofit food pantries as they work to provide assistance for individuals and families in need.

RZ 2018-SU-016/SE 2018-SU-011 (PAG Chantilly P1, LLC) -

Tax Map # 34-1 ((1)) 2C. The applicant is requesting a rezoning of the subject property from the I-5 district to the C-8 district to allow two Special Exceptions permitting the construction of an automobile dealership and a waiver of minimum lot size requirements to reduce lot width along Route 50 from 200 feet to 198 feet. Staff recommends approval of RZ 2018-SU-016 and SE 2018-SU-011. The Planning Commission unanimously approved this application at their meeting on January 16, 2019. # Business Hazardous Waste Disposal Event Dates Announced



Businesses or Fairfax County Government agencies that generate small quantities of hazardous waste may qualify as <a href="Very Small Quantity Generators">Very Small Quantity Generators</a> (VSQGs). This program provides a legal and affordable solution to hazardous waste disposal. The benefit of the program is that is offers prices well-below the normal cost of disposing of hazardous waste directly with a hazardous waste disposal contractor. Additionally, the program eliminates painstaking recordkeeping requirements to businesses and institutions that contract for disposal directly with hazardous waste disposal service providers.

The next VSQG event will take place on **Wednesday**, **January 23**, **2019**. **The event runs from 9:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.**, rain or shine. Business/commercial hazardous waste may only be disposed of on a scheduled business disposal say by small businesses that meet federal and state requirements. To view the full

- 4. **Talk about learn more about mental health.** Being more open about your mental health helps others understand your needs, and allows them to be supportive to you.
- 5. **Help others.** Perform small random acts of kindness, express appreciation for people you care about, or volunteer in your spare time.

Winter months can be hard on mood and can spark Seasonal Affective Disorder. If you are feeling down or start feeling disinterested in things you love, notice appetite or sleep changes, take a <u>free, anonymous mental health screening</u>; it can be the first step toward getting back on track.

**Recycle Your Electronics** 

Electronic products are made from metal, plastics, and glass - all of which require energy to mine and manufacture. Reusing and recycling these materials conserves natural resources. In addition, many electronics contain lead, mercury, beryllium, and cadmium. If improperly disposed of, these contaminates may be released into the environment.

The E-Cycling program is a community service to the residents of Fairfax County only. There is a maximum limit of 10 large items per residential drop-off (i.e., TVs, printers, scanners, computers, etc...).

#### **Before Donating or Recycling Your Used Electronics:**

- Delete all personal information from your electronic device.
- Remove any batteries from your electronics as they may need to be recycled separately.
