<u>Need Help Paying Your Fairfax Water Bill? Apply for Assistance by</u> <u>December 30, 2020:</u>

- To provide financial relief for customers in need, Fairfax Water is working with Fairfax County, the City of Falls Church and the City of Fairfax to administer funds received from the Commonwealth of Virginia's COVID-19 Municipal Utility Relief Program. <u>Details</u>
- **Customers will need to apply for this relief program.** To qualify, you must meet certain eligibility requirements, attest that you are experiencing financial hardship due to the coronavirus public health emergency, and submit an application to Fairfax Water **no later than December 30, 2020**.
- An application is available on <u>Fairfax Water's website</u>. For additional assistance, call Fairfax Water's customer service department to discuss payment options. The call center is available weekdays, 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. at 703-698-5800, TTY 711.

Search Underway for Next Fairfax County Police Chief:

- Fairfax County is conducting a nationwide search for the next chief of police. <u>Details</u>

zMOD Town Hall Follow-Up



Thank you to all those who attended the zMOD Town Hall on Wednesday, December 9. It was wonderful to hear from Casey Judge and Carmen Bishop, staff members from Fairfax County, who provided great information about the modernized zoning ordinance. They discussed the zMOD timeline, the new Ordinance Structure, various methods of community outreach in the county and in the Sully District, reasons for updating the Zoning ordinance, and modernizing uses. Carmen went into detail about the updates, advertised options, and monitoring to Accessory Living Units. Then, Casey explored Home Based Business Use, how neighborhood compatibility would be ensured through zMOD, and advertised options. They also explained how to navigate the <u>zMOD draft on the county's website</u>.

Participants of the meeting had some excellent questions, which were read aloud during the Q&A session. The meeting lasted an hour and thirty minutes, and 38 individuals participated. If you have any additional questions or comments, email <u>sully@fairfaxcounty.gov</u>.

Fairfax County Update on the COVID-19 Vaccine:

- The Health Department has launched a <u>new webpage</u> with information regarding COVID-19 vaccines.
- On December 11, 2020, the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) issued the first emergency use authorization (EUA) for COVID-19 vaccine in individuals 16 years of age and older. The emergency use authorization allows the Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 Vaccine to be distributed in the U.S. <u>Get the facts on the Pfizer-BioNTech vaccine.</u>
- Based on new information provided on December 3 by the federal government's Operation Warp Speed, Virginia is now preparing to receive an estimated total of 480,000 doses of vaccine from two manufacturers (Pfizer and Moderna) by the end of December 2020. This initial distribution will ensure 480,000 health care personnel (HCP) and longterm care facility (LTCF) residents receive a first dose of the vaccine, beginning the inoculation process for nearly all members of Virginia's two top-priority groups, if we receive this expected allotment. <u>Details</u>

Transportation News



Fairfax Connector Resumes Fare Collection, Launches New and Enhanced Service January 4, 2021:

- <u>Fairfax Connector</u> will resume fare collection and front door boarding on all routes starting Monday, January 4, 2021. <u>Details</u>
- To protect the health and safety of passengers and bus operators as front door boarding resumes, polycarbonate driver shields (pictured above) have been installed in the buses.
- Fairfax Connector passengers are reminded that wearing a face covering while in the bus continues to be mandatory.

<u>VDOT - Route 29 in Centreville Reduced to Two Lanes Under I-66 for</u> <u>Continued Bridge Demolition This Weekend, December 18-21:</u>

- Demolition of the remaining I-66 bridge span and piers will require Route 29 in Centreville to be reduced to a single lane in each direction between 9:00 p.m. Friday, December 18, and 5:00 a.m. Monday, December 21. All work is weather dependent and will be rescheduled if inclement conditions occur. Details
- Two-way traffic will run on the northbound side of Route 29 starting around 9:00 p.m. Friday, December 18, through Saturday, December 19. The traffic pattern will switch around 9:00 p.m. Saturday, with twoway traffic on the southbound side of Route 29 for the remainder of the weekend.
- During the overnight hours Friday through Sunday nights, December 18-20, flaggers will alternate a single lane of traffic in each direction.
- Drivers using ramps to and from I-66 will not be allowed to make left turns during this time.

<u>VDOT - Loop Ramp from Route 29 South to I-66 West in Centreville Re-</u> <u>Opening to Traffic on or about Wednesday, December 23, 2020:</u>

• The loop ramp from Route 29 South to I-66 West in Centreville will re-open on or about Wednesday, December 23. Drivers on southbound Route 29 will stay to the right to access the ramp after passing under I-66. Details

Drivers should always use caution and pay attention to lane markings and roadway signs in construction work zones. All work is weather dependent and will be rescheduled if inclement conditions occur.

Recycling & Trash FAQs

1. What materials can I recycle?

• **Answer:** See the <u>Residential Materials Index</u> for a list of all items that can be recycled or disposed of in Fairfax County. In addition to common recyclables, you will find information about recycling computers, motor oil, packaging peanuts and much more!

2. What plastics can I recycle?

• **Answer:** The only types of plastic that are required to be recycled in Fairfax County are plastic bottles and jugs. Some companies also collect additional plastics (e.g., margarine tubs, yogurt containers) at the curb. Participation is voluntary. Contact whoever picks up your trash for more information.

3. Who should I call to get a recycling bin?

- **Answer:** If a private company collects your trash, please call them directly.
- 4. What are the fees for disposing of different materials?
 - **Answer:** <u>Click here</u> to view Residential Disposal Fees.
- 5. The woods behind our neighborhood have become a dumping ground for brush, trash, tires, etc. How can I get it cleaned up?
 - Answer: No person may dispose of solid waste on any private or public property without the permission of the owner. This prohibits illegal dumping in commercial building dumpsters or any site not designated for disposal use by the general public. If you witness release of petroleum or other flammable or hazardous materials,

call **911**. If you see anyone dump nonhazardous solid waste, record the vehicle license number and call the Fairfax County Police nonemergency number at **703-691-2131**, **TTY 703-204-2264**, to report the violator. If you find illegally dumped material on public or private property, but did not witness the dumping, call the Department of Code Compliance at **703-324-1300**, **TTY 711**, or submit a <u>complaint online</u>. To identify the property owner, go to the county's <u>Real Estate Assessment Information Site</u>.
