Evictions on Hold Through Dec. 31; Resources Available for Residents:

- To protect public health and slow the spread of COVID-19, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (<u>CDC</u>) has issued a temporary moratorium on evictions through December 31, 2020.
- The moratorium applies to people with **incomes less than \$99,000 or \$198,000 if married and filing jointly**, unable to pay rent due to income loss or extraordinary out of pocket medical expenses and would become homeless if evicted. Tenants facing eviction need to present a declaration to their landlord.
- If you are having trouble making rent payments because of the coronavirus pandemic, you are not alone. Federal, state and local governments continue to offer relief and resources to protect tenants. <u>Click here</u> to view resources available to county residents.

<u>Need Help Paying Your Fairfax Water Bill? Apply for Assistance by</u> <u>December 30, 2020:</u>

To provide financial relief for customers in need, Fairfax Water is working with Fairfax County, the City of Falls Church and the City of Fairfax to administer funds received from the Commonwealth of Virginia's COVID-19 Municipal Utility Relief Program. <u>Details</u> **Customers will need to apply for this relief program.** To qualify, you must meet certain eligibility requirements, attest that you are experiencing financial hardship due to the coronavirus public health emergency, and submit an application to Fairfax Water **no later than December 30, 2020.
