# Sully District Proposed Striping Modifications

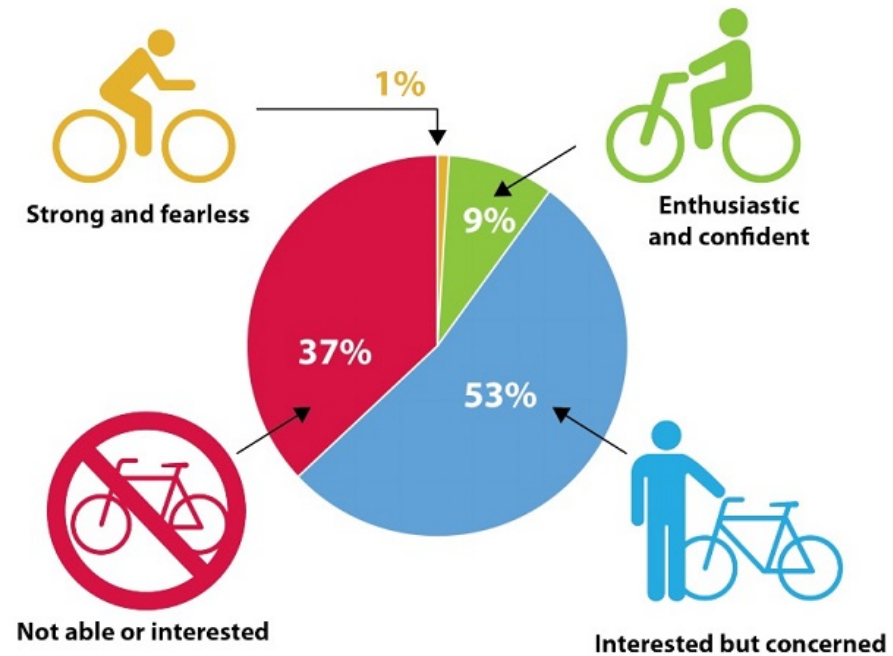


# FAIRFAX COUNTY COMPREHENSIVE PLAN

- Seeks to improve traffic safety and provide transportation options to people around the County
- [Bicycle Network Plan](#): Establishes key bike route network and suggests type of bicycle facility
- Safer/more comfortable facility type can be implemented if space allows
- Routes can be added to connect destinations/origins to the bike network
- Implementation Options (if no road widening needed):
  - Capital Projects (\$\$\$)
  - Through Paving & Restriping Process (\$)

# TYPES OF BICYCLE FACILITIES IN FAIRFAX COUNTY



SHARED LANE MARKING (SHARROW)

Shared lane markings indicate a shared travel lane for bicycles and cars.



Motorists may legally cross the double yellow line in order to safely pass a person riding a bicycle, as long as the oncoming lane is clear.



STANDARD BIKE LANE

Bike lanes give bicycles and cars their own spaces, making it safer to pass legally.

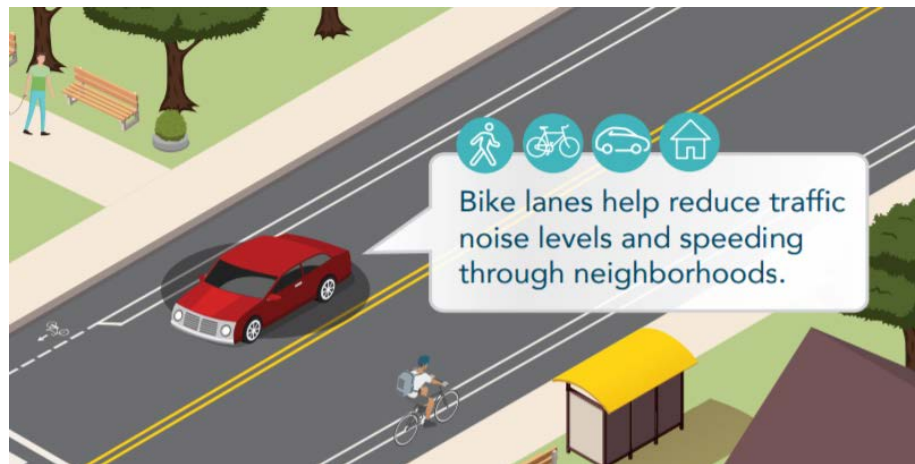


BUFFERED BIKE LANE

Buffered bike lanes provide additional space between bicycles and cars. The extra space makes both cycling and driving more comfortable.

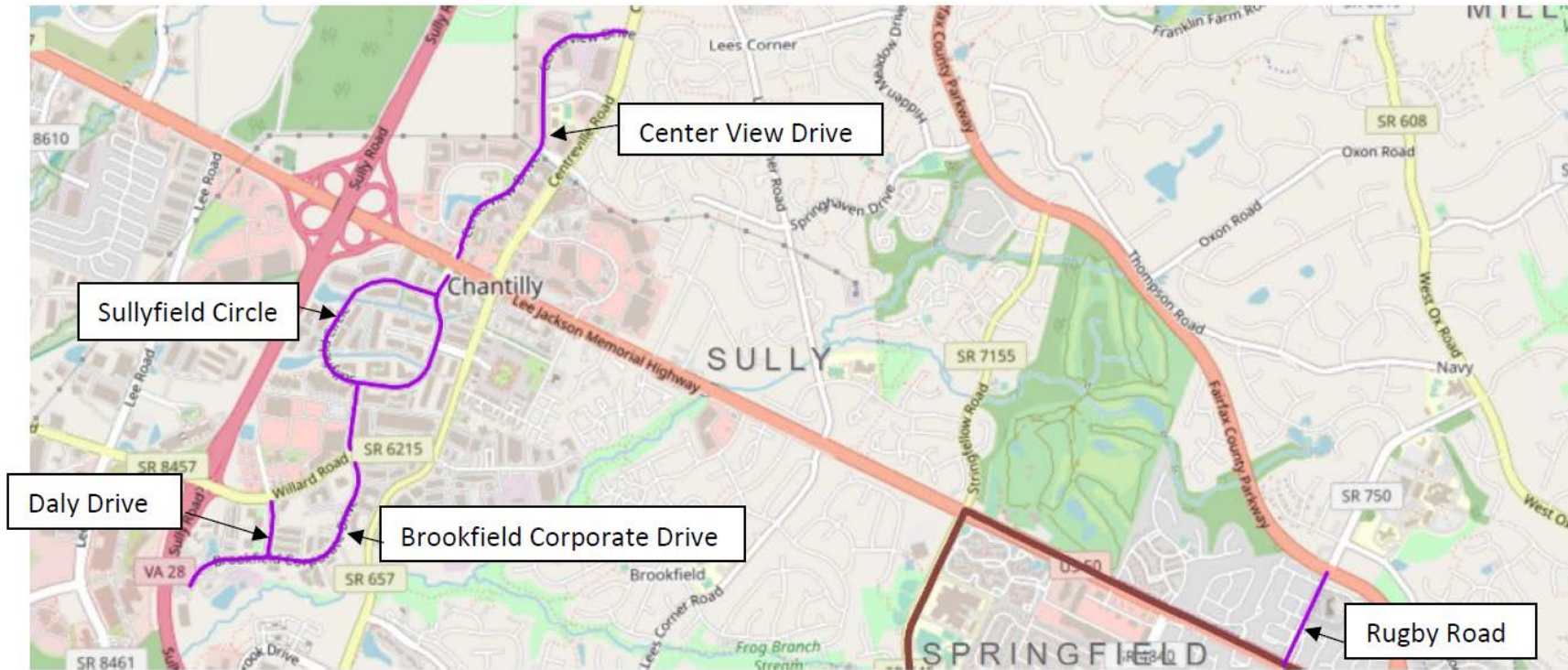


Top speeds virtually eliminated

# BROOKFIELD CORPORATE DRIVE - EXISTING

- From Sullyfield Circle to end of road
- Two travel lanes
- Sections of sidewalk on both sides
- On-street parking on both sides
- No on-street bike facilities



# BROOKFIELD CORPORATE DRIVE - PROPOSED

- From Sullyfield Circle to end of road
- Add bike lanes





# CENTERVIEW DRIVE - EXISTING

- Between Lee Jackson Memorial Highway and Lowe Street
- Two travel lanes
- Center turn lane
- Sidewalk on both sides



# CENTERVIEW DRIVE - PROPOSED

- Between Lee Jackson Memorial Highway and Lowe Street
- Two travel lanes
- Bike lanes
- Center turn lane or buffered bike lanes in wider sections



# DALY DRIVE - EXISTING

- Between Willard Road and Brookfield Corporate Drive
- Two travel lanes
- Sidewalks on both sides
- On-street parking on both sides
- No bike facilities





# DALY DRIVE - PROPOSED

- Between Willard Road and Brookfield Corporate Drive
- Add center line
- Add bike lanes



# RUGBY ROAD - EXISTING

- Between Lee Jackson Memorial Highway and Fairfax County Parkway
- Four travel lanes, with median
- Sidewalk or trail on both sides
- No bike facilities



# RUGBY ROAD - PROPOSED

- Between Lee Jackson Memorial Highway and Fairfax County Parkway
- Convert underutilized outside travel lanes to buffered bike lanes





# SULLYFIELD CIRCLE - EXISTING

- From Lee Jackson Memorial Highway to Sullyfield Circle
- Two travel lanes
- Sidewalk on both sides
- On-street parking on both sides
- No bike facilities



# SULLYFIELD CIRCLE - PROPOSED

- From Lee Jackson Memorial Highway to Sullyfield Circle
- Add bike lanes
- Existing on-street parking will be maintained



# PEDESTRIAN SAFETY

Opportunity to review

- Study busy pedestrian crossing locations without crosswalk markings
- Upgrade existing crosswalk striping
- Evaluate for signage and other safety improvements
