



Meet Braddock District Supervisor John C. Cook



On March 17, 2009 Supervisor Cook was sworn in as Braddock District Supervisor after winning a Special Election called to fill Supervisor Sharon Bulova's seat, when she was elected Chairman. He was elected to his second term on November 8, 2011. As Supervisor, he has paid special attention to strengthening our neighborhoods, providing responsive constituent services, working on innovative transportation solutions and serving as a voice for fiscal restraint and responsibility on the Board.

Supervisor Cook is the Chairman of the Fairfax County – Fairfax City Inter-jurisdictional Committee, Vice-Chair of the Board's "50+" Committee, and the Chair of the new George Mason University Fairfax Campus Advisory Board (FCAB). He also serves as Treasurer to the Virginia Railway Express (VRE) Operations Board and is a member of the Northern Virginia Transportation Commission (NVTC). In addition, Supervisor Cook serves on the Northern Virginia Regional Commission (NVRC).

In 2008 as a Civic Association President, Mr. Cook was selected by then-Supervisor Sharon Bulova to receive the 2008 Braddock District "Community Champion" award from Volunteer Fairfax for his work on the Kings Park Civic Association revitalization program. He served as vice president of the Kings Park/Kings Glen Parent-Teacher Association (PTA) for two years and served for three years as a member of the Fairfax County School Board's Advisory Committee on Adult and Community Education. Mr. Cook coached girls softball through the Braddock Road Youth Club (BRYC) and served as an assistant coach for Catholic Youth Organization's (CYO) girl's basketball.

Supervisor Cook is a managing partner in his Oakton law firm of Cook, Craig & Francuzenko, PLLC., and is a member of Burke United Methodist Church. He lives with his wife and six children in the Kings Park community of Braddock District.

What Is The Fairfax County Board of Supervisors? <http://www.fairfaxcounty.gov/government/board/>

Fairfax County has an elected Board of Supervisors consisting of nine members elected by district, plus a chairman elected at-large. The law requires that districts be of approximately equal population and that the supervisors (other than the chairman) be residents and qualified voters of their districts and be elected only by voters living in those districts. All voters in the County may vote for the chairman. The Board elects the vice chairman annually from among its members at its first meeting in January. Board members are elected for four-year terms.

The Board establishes County government policy, passes resolutions and ordinances (within the limits of its authority established by the Virginia General Assembly), approves the budget, sets local tax rates, approves land use plans and makes appointments to various positions. These actions are taken in open meetings, which residents are encouraged to attend. All discussions are held in public, with the exception of issues exempt by the Virginia Freedom of Information Act, such as legal or personnel issues.

Meetings are held at 1:00 p.m. on the third Wednesday every month, except August. Fairfax County was established in 1742. In 2002 the population of the County reached 1.0 million, and as of 2010 the population was 1,081,726, which exceeds that of eight states. Fairfax County has evolved from a rural community to a vibrant and growing business and technology hub.

There are 584,000 jobs in the County and more than 113.4 million square feet of office space countywide.



Enrolling your children in school

If you need to enroll your children in school you may call 703-329-9831 to find out which school serves your new address or you may use the FCPS boundary locator online at <http://boundary.fcps.edu/boundary/>. You may also visit the Fairfax County Public School's website and download all proper forms to enroll students at <http://www.fcps.edu/it/forms/enroll.pdf>

To register your child you will also need proof of residency, proof of birth, documentation of previous education programs and health documentation. Register to vote

You may register to vote year-round except during the 21 days prior to a General or Primary election, 13 days prior to a Special election, or 6 days prior to a Special election called by the Governor (Code of Virginia §§ 24.2-416).

To register you must be a citizen of the United States, at least 18 years of age by the next general election and a resident of Virginia.

You may vote Absentee in person at the Fairfax County Government Center at 12000 Government Center Parkway in Fairfax, Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday 8:00 a.m. - 4:30 p.m., and Thursday, 8:00 a.m - 7:00 p.m. If you have any questions you may call 703-222-0776 phone, 703-324-2205 fax or 703-324-4700 for 24-hour recorded information.

Private haulers can be found in the Yellow Pages and other publications. Recycling of items such as cardboard, mixed paper, metal food and beverage containers, glass bottles, jars, plastic bottles, jugs, grass, leaves and brush is required at all residential properties, all nonresidential properties, and institutions. You may also check with your service provider to see if they collect additional materials. In addition you may haul your own garbage to one of the sites located around the County. 
