Welcome to the Braddock District! Braddock is very much a district of neighborhoods, a rarity in busy and booming Fairfax. Stretching from Annandale to the Fairfax County Government Center, we are located in the center of Fairfax County.

Fairfax County has an elected Board of Supervisors consisting of nine members elected by district, plus a chairman elected at-large. Board members are elected for four-year terms and establish County government policy, pass resolutions and ordinances, approve the budget, set local tax rates, approve land use plans and make appointments to various positions.

A primary focus of mine as Braddock Supervisor is to make sure that County government is working effectively and efficiently, doing the things it is supposed to do, and acting as a committed facilitator and partner in our communities. Strong communities are ones with strong connections between people.

This guide is designed to provide you with some important information about your County and District. Your local government is here to serve you. Whether you need to know important phone numbers for County services or which school serves your community, we are here to provide you with that information.

# About Supervisor Cook

John C. Cook was sworn in as a member of the Fairfax County Board of Supervisors, representing the Braddock District, in March, 2009. Supervisor Cook was named the 2014 Shelter House Community Champion for his work fighting domestic violence and was given the 2014 President's Award by the Fairfax County NAACP.

As a member of the Board of Supervisors he serves as the Co-chair of the joint County/School Infrastructure Finance Committee, Chairman of the Fairfax County – Fairfax City Inter-jurisdictional Committee, Vice-Chair of the Board's "50+" Committee and as the Board's representative to the Domestic Violence Prevention, Policy and Coordinating Council of Fairfax County. He also serves as the Vice Chair for the VRE Operations Board, the Metropolitan Washington Air Quality Committee, and as the Chair of the Legislative Committee of the Northern Virginia Regional Commission. He was appointed to Northern Virginia Transportation Commission in January 2010.

Mr. Cook is a former president of the Kings Park Civic Association, where he designed and implemented a community revitalization program. In 2008 he was named the Braddock District "Community Champion" by Volunteer Fairfax. Mr. Cook is the managing partner of the Fairfax law firm Cook Craig & Kitts. He lives with his wife and children in the Kings Park Community of Braddock District.

# New to Fairfax County?

## Enrolling Children in School

If you need to enroll your children in school you may call 703-329-9831 to find out which school serves your new address or you may use the FCPS boundary locator at <http://boundary.fcps.edu/boundary/>. You may also visit the Fairfax County Public School's website and download all proper forms to enroll students at <http://www.fcps.edu/parents/start/>. To register your child you will also need proof of residency, proof of birth, documentation of previous education programs and health documentation.



## Registering to Vote

You may register to vote year-round except during the 21 days prior to a General or Primary election, 13 days prior to a Special election, or 6 days prior to a Special election called by the Governor (Code of Virginia §§ 24.2-416). To register you must be a citizen of the United States, at least 18 years of age by the next general election and a resident of Virginia.

You may vote Absentee in person at the Fairfax County Government Center at 12000 Government Center Parkway in Fairfax, Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday 8 a.m. - 4:30 p.m., and Thursday, 8 a.m - 7 p.m. If you have any questions you may call 703-222-0776 phone, 703-324-2205 fax or 703-324-4700 for 24-hour recorded information.
