<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> Due to the pandemic and the Virginia Supreme Court's Order declaring the COVID-19 Judicial Emergency issued on March 16, 2020, all jury trials were suspended until November 9, 2020. Only criminal jury trials were resumed through winter of 2020. While the number of jurors called in for service was greatly reduced, the operating costs for the jury division did not change, thus there is a substantially higher cost-rate for the "per juror" estimate.

#### Goal

To ensure efficient civil case intake, processing, records management and timely scheduling of cases brought before the Judges of the 19th Judicial Circuit.

### **Objective**

To achieve a final disposition rate of 87 percent for Law cases finalized within 1 year of the initial filing date. The state average is 75 percent and the voluntary case processing guidelines adopted by the Judicial Council recommends 90 percent disposition of cases filed within one year of initial filing.
