During the public hearing and public forums, participants will have an opportunity to make presentations and take part in small focus group discussions designed to gather information on the housing and human services needs of county residents. Be prepared to let the county know: **What are your housing needs? What do you need to be able to meet your housing costs and family's needs? What, if any, are fair housing concerns for you? What are the community development and human service needs of the county? How well is the county performing to meet those needs?**

The hearing and focus groups are open to the public and the CCFAC is particularly interested in hearing from:

- Citizens who are in need of or are receiving affordable housing and/or other assistance (affordable housing means housing that you can financially afford at a low-income level and still meet other basic living needs); and
- Local community or faith-based organizations and private enterprises that provide direct services to and/or advocate for low-income individuals and families.

The Board of Supervisors will approve the final plan and it will be submitted to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) next year as part

of a federal requirement that combines the broad planning requirements of the National Affordable Housing Act of 1990 with the annual applications and reporting for the HUD-funded programs that are administered by Fairfax County. The Consolidated Plan One-Year Action Plan for FY 2015 is available from Malia Stroble.
