

**CONSOLIDATED COMMUNITY FUNDING POOL
Fiscal Years 2013-2014 PROGRAM DESCRIPTIONS**

**Laura's House
Brain Foundation, The
Regions 1, 2, 3, 4**

This project provides for the acquisition of three 4 bedroom townhomes which will be rented at affordable rents to extremely low income individuals with serious and persistent brain diseases.

**RIHC Affordable Housing Acquisition Program
Reston Interfaith Housing Corporation
Regions 3**

The agency will acquire and preserve four townhomes in the Reston/Herndon area (2 will be acquired in FY 2013 and 2 more the following fiscal year). The town homes will be upgraded and incorporated into RIHC's ongoing housing program to provide affordable housing to low income families.

**Mt. Vernon Village VI
Good Shepherd Housing & Family Services, Inc.
Region 1**

This project provides for the acquisition of four housing units (2 will be acquired in FY 2013 and 2 more the following fiscal year) to provide affordable rental housing for very low-income households in Region 1.

**Basic Needs
United Community Ministries
Region 1**

The program will provide emergency food assistance, emergency financial assistance to help families avoid eviction and/or utility disconnection, information and referral services as well as linkages to other community based resources.

**Emergency Needs Assistance
ECHO, Inc.
Regions 1, 2, 4**

ECHO is an all volunteer run organization that serves the emergency and basic human needs of residents in Springfield and Burke areas. The program provides emergency financial assistance to cover utility bills to avert cut-off of services and rental/mortgage expenses to avoid eviction.

**Multicultural Human Services
Northern Virginia Family Service (NVFS)
Regions 1, 2, 3, 4**

The program provides mental health and social service programs to English-limited immigrant and refugee individuals and families in Fairfax County, for whom existing services are inaccessible due to language and cultural barriers, an overburdened workforce, or fees that are not affordable. Services include the provision of direct assistance, case management, individual, family and group therapy, psychiatric evaluations, medication management and legal immigration services.

**Integrated Immigrant Services Program
GRACE Ministries of the UMC
Regions 1, 2, 3, 4**

The program will provide emergency assistance through distribution of food, clothing and other basic necessities on a monthly basis. In addition, the program will provide job training programs that combine focused ESL instruction and job skills in the areas of personal care aide training, certified nurse's aide and commercial driver's license training for school bus drivers. The goal of the program is

to reduce the language barriers so that the immigrant community can improve their employment situation and move toward self-sufficiency.

RI Affordable Housing Administration

Reston Interfaith, Inc.

Region 3

This project manages and maintains affordable housing units while integrating comprehensive social services that assist clients in progressing towards self-sufficiency over a 3 month to 3 year period.

Family Assistance

Our Daily Bread

Regions 1, 2, 3, 4

The program includes three service components: food assistance, financial assistance and financial literacy to assist low income families who are experiencing financial crises. The food program coordinates with over 30 participating congregations and businesses to collect, bag and deliver weekly food to families in need. Financial assistance is provided for rent and utility assistance, auto repair, and medications; while the financial education program provides one-on-one financial mentoring and personal finance classes.

Job Skills Training- Computer Literacy & Educational Pathways

Computer CORE

Regions 1, 2, 3, 4

Computer CORE works to help low-income adults acquire the technological and life skills to enable them to pursue career aspirations. CORE's program includes Microsoft Office, Internet Explorer, and keyboard training for students to meet the standards needed for an administrative position. The program also provides trainees with home computers to improve their skills and increase their accessibility to job opportunities. The trainees have the opportunity to earn 7 college credits for their coursework through Northern Virginia Community College.

Wraparound Family Caregiver Support Program

Alzheimer's Family Day

Regions 1, 2, 3, 4

The program provides services for family caregivers of adults with Alzheimer's disease and related dementia. Services include family caregiver support groups and education workshops.

Emergency & Self-Sufficiency Services Program

Reston Interfaith, Inc.

Region 3

The program provides emergency services, including food, personal care supplies, short-term wellness support services and referrals for clothing/financial assistance. The program is being expanded to an additional location at the Herndon Neighborhood Resource Center to serve low-income, predominantly immigrant residents by providing a drop-in center for direct assistance with personal, academic, employment and social needs, including ESOL classes.

Bailey's Supportive Housing Program

Volunteers of America Chesapeake

Region 2

This project will place 14 chronically homeless individuals with mental illness into permanent housing with access to ongoing case management designed to strengthen their ability to lead an independent, secure life.

Laurie Mitchell Employment Center- TEC 2000**ServiceSource, Inc.****Regions 1, 2, 3, 4**

ServiceSource, in collaboration with the Laurie Mitchell Employment Center (LMEC), will facilitate the Technical Employment Connections 2000 (TEC 2000) program. The Information Technology Training is designed to assist people with disabilities to become productive and independent members of society. Participants will gain significant basic competencies through the completion of a curriculum with soft skills job preparation training and customized job placement provided to all graduates. The curriculum is developed to not only address entry level deficiencies consistently found among individuals with disabilities within the service delivery system, but also includes employability skills, and administrative skills training needed for successful employment.

Volunteer Home Repair Program**Rebuilding Together Arlington/Fairfax/Falls Church****Regions 1, 2, 3, 4**

The program organizes teams of community volunteers led by experienced "house captains" to make critical repairs at no cost to low-income homeowners and nonprofit organizations, such as transitional housing providers. The repairs meet critical needs based on a detailed inspection, including: accessibility modifications, correction of health and safety hazards, energy efficiency improvements, and structural repairs.

Bryant Early Learning Center (BEL)**United Community Ministries****Region 1**

The program provides Early Childhood programming to infants, toddlers and preschoolers between the ages of six weeks and five years. The program focuses on providing a developmentally appropriate environment that fosters children's growth, development and prepares them to transition successfully from Preschool to Kindergarten.

Assisting Young Mothers**Alternative House****Regions 1, 2, 3, 4**

The program will provide transitional housing services to young women between the ages of 16 and 22 who are pregnant or have small children. Services will include life skills training, educational and employment goal setting, budget counseling and assistance with parenting skills.

Advocating in Court for the Best Interests of Children in Crisis due to Abuse & Neglect**Fairfax Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA), Inc.****Regions 1, 2, 3, 4**

Fairfax CASA has proposed to recruit, screen, train and supervise citizen volunteers to serve as Court Appointed Special Advocates for children who are placed under the Courts supervision. The CASA volunteers will conduct independent investigations, monitor each assigned case, write and submit a written report to the juvenile judge hearing the case, provide recommendations to the judge regarding the child's best interest and assist the legal representative for each case.

Reduced/No-Charge Mental Health**Women's Center, The****Regions 2, 3**

The program will provide mental health services, which includes reduced-fee counseling to low income families and individuals in Vienna and Bailey's Crossroads. The program will also provide onsite therapy to individuals and families at local shelters, transitional housing agencies, and other nonprofit serving the targeted population. The goal of the program is to assist clients in psychological crisis with resolving immediate mental health symptoms and regain emotional resilience, thereby enabling them to attain self-sufficiency over a period of three months to three years.

Challenge to Change**OAR of Fairfax County, Inc.****Regions 1, 2, 3, 4**

The program provides the assistance necessary to help ex-offenders and their families to overcome the crises resulting from arrest, incarceration and release. The program also assists ex-offenders and their families to obtain self-sufficiency after the criminal justice system involvement. These goals are achieved by providing: direct assistance, employment services, skills training/educational classes, violence intervention, case management, mentoring and referrals. Services are also designed to address the need for alternatives to incarceration and to reduce the incidence of recidivism among the offender population.

Client Services**Western Fairfax Christian Ministries****Region 4**

The program provides financial assistance to families in Centreville, Chantilly, Clifton, Fairfax Station and the 22033 zip code area of Fairfax. Client support consists of emergency financial assistance up to \$300 annually to help with rent/mortgage payments to keep clients from becoming homeless and for assistance with utility payments to keep services from being disconnected. Counselors will advocate to other community organizations if client needs exceed the resources of WFCM.

Housing for CSB Jail Diversion Program**Community Havens, Inc.****Regions 1, 2, 3, 4**

The program will purchase and renovate (2), two-bedroom condominiums located in Fairfax County, which will be rented to up to 4 persons that are enrolled in the Community Service Board's (CSB) Jail Diversion program. The clients, who face incarceration due to infractions caused by mental health conditions, will be diverted from jail into permanent supportive housing and recovery programs that advance their abilities to manage their illnesses and live independently in the community.

Emergency Services-Keeping Families at Home**Good Shepherd Housing & Family Services, Inc.****Region 1**

In coordination with other service providers, the program will provide emergency financial assistance (rent, utility or security deposits), housing counseling and referrals (food, job centers and other resources) to prevent residents of Human Services Region 1 from becoming homeless.

Annandale Safe Youth Project**Alternative House****Region 2**

The program proposes to provide after-school programming to at-risk youth enrolled in middle school who reside in the Annandale community. Program services will include homework assistance, tutoring, field trips, supervised recreation and community learning projects.

Culmore Safe Youth Project**Alternative House****Region 2**

The program proposes to provide afterschool programming to youth enrolled in middle school who reside in the Bailey's Crossroads/Culmore community. Services will include homework assistance, tutoring, field trips, supervised recreation and community learning projects.

Family Assistance Prevention/Crisis Intervention**Herndon-Reston FISH, Inc.****Region 3**

Herndon-Reston FISH proposes to provide emergency financial assistance for rent/mortgage and utilities to individuals who are experiencing a crisis. The program will also provide transportation services to assist elderly and disabled persons to their medical appointments. Additionally, the program will provide holiday food and gift boxes to eligible participants. Financial Literacy workshops will be offered to help participants develop the skills necessary to manage their household budgets.

Northern Virginia Dental Clinic**Northern Virginia Dental Clinic, Inc.****Regions 1, 2, 3, 4**

The program provides dental services to low income and uninsured adults (200% of federal poverty) that are referred by local nonprofit agencies and local jurisdictions. Each individual referred to the clinic will receive a comprehensive oral examination and an oral cancer screening to establish their current state of oral health. Based on the exams, a detailed treatment plan will be developed for each client. Services may include: restorations, oral surgery, biopsies, periodontics, dentures/crowns, endodontics, cleanings and emergency interventions.

Project Independence: Helping Fairfax-Burke Seniors Age in Place**Shepherd Center of Fairfax-Burke****Regions 2, 4**

The program provides a variety of services to meet the diverse needs of seniors living independently in the Fairfax-Burke community. Funds will be used to provide seniors aged 50+ with a variety of enrichment and socialization services including: Adventures in Learning, Lunch 'n Life, exercise classes, Friendly Caller/Visitor program and Wednesday at the Movies. Additionally, the program offers free transportation to medical appointments and companion shopping transportation to grocery stores, banks, libraries, barbershop and other appropriate locations.

Food for Others/Fairfax**Food for Others****Regions 1, 2, 3, 4**

The program provides emergency and supplemental food to low income residents of Fairfax County through three distribution programs. The emergency food/USDA program provides clients referred by county staff and other service providers with food estimated to last several days allowing time for other sources of assistance to be arranged or the crisis to pass. Clients meeting the income eligibility guidelines may return monthly for USDA commodities at the Merrifield warehouse. A second supplementary food program distributes food on weeknights to 13 high-poverty neighborhoods in the county. The third program is the bulk distribution program that provides food to more than 23 community-based organizations. These organizations then deliver food to the elderly, homebound, homeless and others in need.

Successful Start**Falls Church-McLean Children's Center****Regions 2, 3**

The program proposes to provide full day early childhood educational programming to low income families with children between the ages of 2 to 5. Activities include on-site early intervention screening services, educational activities and weekly field trips.

Artemis House**Shelter House, Inc.****Regions 1, 2, 3, 4**

Artemis House is a domestic violence shelter, operated under contract with the county. The shelter serves up to 34 people at any given time in apartments at an undisclosed "safe house" location. The

critical elements of the program are the crisis hotline, crisis intervention, crisis shelter, safety planning, immediate basic needs assistance, and comprehensive service planning and case management to help clients cultivate self-sufficiency and prepare for a transition to safe and stable housing.

Family Child Care Educator Training & Workforce Development

Infant Toddler Family Day

Regions 1, 2, 3, 4

The program proposes to provide training and support services to low-income immigrants which will help them to obtain the skills needed to open a family child care business in their home. Participants will be provided an opportunity to obtain a college Infant Toddler Certificate and/or a Child Development Associate (CDA) certification. The goal of the program is to assist participants in becoming economically self-sufficient.

Culmore Youth Outreach Program

Alternative House

Region 2

The program provides after-school programming to teens who reside in the Bailey's Crossroads/Culmore community. Services will include homework assistance, supervised recreation, community service learning projects, job training, field trips and visits to college campuses.

Legal Aid- Housing & Employment

Legal Services of Northern Virginia

Regions 1, 2, 3, 4

The proposal will provide legal service (assistance and representation) to low income families and individuals in the areas of housing and employment law. Specific problems encountered by low-income Fairfax County residents include: evictions, housing code violations and poor living conditions, the potential loss of housing subsidies or public housing rights, housing or employment discrimination, illegal termination of employment, and denial of just compensation for labor.

Legal Aid- Families & Consumers

Legal Services of Northern Virginia

Regions 1, 2, 3, 4

The proposal will provide legal service (assistance and representation) to low income families and individuals through its five practice areas: (1) Family Law, (2) The Law Center for Children, (3) Consumer Law, (4) Elder Law, and (5) the Public Benefits Unit. The program addresses two problems related to stabilizing family income: practices that deleteriously affect family income including unfair garnishment of wages, unfair debt collection and consumer fraud, and; unfair barriers to the receipt of entitled benefits. The benefits include Medicaid, Medicare, SSD, SSI, food stamps, local hospitalization and access to housing.

Adult Basic Literacy/ESOL Tutoring & Classroom Programs

Literacy Council of Northern VA

Regions 1, 2, 3, 4

The program provides beginning level literacy and English language education through four programs: basic adult literacy tutoring helps students who need assistance with reading and writing; ESOL tutoring provides one-on-one English to low income immigrant adults; family learning program provides classroom ESOL instruction to adults and their children; ESOL learning centers provides classroom based beginning level English language and literacy education.

Legal Aid- Access to Justice Route 1**Legal Services of Northern Virginia****Regions 1, 2, 3, 4**

The proposal addresses the need for legal services in South County. The program will provide legal assistance, advocacy, education and outreach to low-income residents of the Route 1 Corridor (South Fairfax County) who have family, housing, consumer and public benefits related matters.

Legal Aid- Immigrant Law Project**Legal Services of Northern Virginia****Regions 1, 2, 3, 4**

The program will provide legal information, outreach, legal advice and representation to immigrants in the areas of housing, family and employment. Legal assistance can address housing, family and employment issues that particularly adversely affect immigrants such as: evictions, domestic violence, and unpaid wages. The program will enable low-income immigrants of Fairfax County to meet their basic needs, have access to services, reduce domestic violence, prevent homelessness and empower low-income immigrant residents.

Virginia Ely Senior Rental Assistance**Catholics for Housing****Regions 1, 3**

The program provides financial assistance to seniors whose incomes do not exceed 30% of the area median income (AMI), which is a disqualifying factor in obtaining residency in Fairfax County owned retirement facilities. The program requires the participants to pay 40% of their income towards their rent and the organization will pay the balance of the monthly rent. By providing rental assistance, the elderly can maintain their independence in a safe and healthy environment because they no longer need to choose between paying for rent and their other basic needs.

Residential, Aftercare & Outreach Programs**Friends of Guest House****Regions 1, 2, 3, 4**

The program provides community based residential services for female non-violent ex-offenders who are on supervision. The Residential Program provides 3-6 months of transitional housing, individualized case management, mental health and substance abuse counseling, mentoring, job-hunting assistance, vocational/GED/other educational training, life skills training and referral as appropriate to other community resources. Graduates of the residential program will then receive Aftercare services for 6-9 months. The program also includes Community Outreach services which are non-residential and are designed for staff to make contact with women 30 to 60 days prior to their release date to provide focused interventions.

Family Assistance Program**Bethany House of Northern VA****Regions 1, 2, 3, 4**

The program provides emergency housing and supportive services to women and children who are victims of Domestic Violence. Services include individualized case management, food assistance, clothing assistance, legal assistance, information/referrals and community outreach.

Emergency Relief Services**Koinonia Foundation, Inc.****Region 1**

The program provides emergency financial assistance, food and clothing to individuals in need of services. Financial assistance will be used to help clients avoid eviction or utility disconnection and will be provided to clients once annually.

Herndon Enrichment Program**Reston Interfaith, Inc.****Region 3**

This project will provide an evening academic program to 3rd-6th graders in several of the elementary schools located in or near the Town of Herndon and for 7th graders at Herndon Middle School. Students will be referred by their public school classroom as needing additional help in strengthening basic skills of reading, writing, spelling and math. The program will be led by professional teachers and offer individualized learning plans for each student based upon identified academic needs.

Career Navigation-Fairfax**Goodwill of Greater Washington****Regions 1, 2**

The program is an intensive three-week employment readiness program that helps the unemployed improve their job search and employability skills. Emphasis is focused on customer service skills to develop a general skill set that will appeal to a wide variety of employers. Through a partnership with Northern Virginia Community College, Goodwill recently launched a more specialized track within its Career Navigation program to provide training in Security and Protective Services.

Family Stabilization & Self-Sufficiency**Family Preservation & Strengthening Services****Regions 1, 2, 3, 4**

The program provides rental assistance and intensive case management services to low-income families to help them to become stabilized and attain self-sufficiency. The participants can enroll in the program for up to a three year period.

Protecting Vulnerable Immigrant Women & Girls fleeing Gender-Based Violence**Tahirih Justice Center****Regions 1, 2, 3, 4**

The program provides immigration legal services to women and girls living in Fairfax County that are fleeing gender-based violence. This program will assist the clients in obtaining legal documents and provide the clients with legal representation in family law matters such as child custody, spousal support petitions, protective orders and divorce modification or enforcement of said matters.

Hermanos y Hermanas Mayores Latino Outreach Initiative**Big Brother Big Sister of the NCA****Regions 1, 2, 3, 4**

The program provides mentoring services to Latino youth between the ages of 8-18. The program staff will recruit and train volunteer mentors and match them with at-risk youth. The volunteer mentors will provide the youth with homework assistance and social recreational activities.

APD Housing Administration**Alliance for the Physically Disabled, The****Regions 1, 2, 3, 4**

The program provides independent residential housing in two adjoining apartments in the Skyline Complex in Falls Church. Young adults with severe physical disabilities, who would otherwise be at risk of institutionalization, live here supported by a resident services coordinator and contracted nursing assistant staff. The apartments have been specially retrofitted to provide easy access for each of the residents and provide a living environment that is 100% accessible to persons with disabilities.

Violence Prevention & Intervention Program**Northern Virginia Family Service (NVFS)****Regions 2, 3**

The program proposes to provide holistic neighborhood-based school connected services to immigrant youth and their families. Services will include case management, individual and family

therapeutic counseling, intensive group-based services for parents and children, youth skill building workshops, youth and family mentoring, and a summer transition program for youth moving on to middle and/or high school.

**Basic Needs: Emergency Financial Assistance & Furniture
Annandale Christian Community for Action (ACCA)**

Region 2

The program is all-volunteer and provides financial assistance for rent/security deposits, utility bills, prescription drugs or medical/dental services and miscellaneous needs such as gasoline, car repair, etc. The program receives referrals from Fairfax County Coordinated Services Planning, public schools, ACCA Child Development Center, community shelters, churches and community organizations. In addition to financial assistance, the program also includes furniture assistance that distributes new and slightly used furniture.

Project HOPE

PRS, Inc.

Regions 1, 2, 3, 4

The program provides long-term supportive counseling and employment services to individuals living with mental illness. Funding will be used to continue existing services through recovery-oriented intensive skills training, supportive counseling and positive behavioral supports to persons living with mental illness who reside in public housing or participate in the housing choice voucher program. The program helps clients to increase their independent living skills, learn to effectively manage symptoms of mental illness and medication, as well as learn to manage their budget in order to meet their monthly expenses.

**Homes for the Working Poor, Elderly, & Disabled
Good Shepherd Housing & Family Services, Inc.**

Region 1

This proposal addresses the need for housing for homeless families and individuals to help them achieve stability and self-sufficiency. The project will offer affordable housing stability through rental of a Good Shepherd property or connection with a partner landlord. The program will also provide supportive services, such as credit counseling/money management and other life skills that promote self-sufficiency.

**Forward Steps: A Youth Development Program
United Community Ministries**

Region 1

The program proposes to provide after-school programming to children and youth in grades K-12. Services will include homework assistance, tutoring, leadership training, enrichment activities and parent involvement activities. The program will deliver services at the Creekside Village and the Sacramento Neighborhood Community Centers.

Self Sufficiency

Lorton Community Action Center

Region 1

The program serves low income families in the Lorton and South County area who need assistance to become self-sufficient. The services offered under the program include: case management, English as a Second Language (ESL) classes, nutrition classes and pro bono legal services. The LCAC case manager works one-on-one with clients that require individual counseling and assistance. Case management includes assistance with budget management, securing and maintaining housing, employment assistance, learning life skills, accessing transportation, resolving medical crises and addressing other issues.

Immigration Legal Services**Just Neighbors Ministry****Regions 1, 2, 3, 4**

The program provides legal immigration services to low-income immigrants and refugees that reside in Fairfax County. The program will assist clients through advice and legal counsel to help them reunite with their family members, escape domestic violence (when applicable), and obtain employment authorization.

Asian Youth Empowerment**Boat People SOS****Regions 2, 4**

This program will help Vietnamese students achieve academic successes, increase their positive life choices, and plan for their careers. Services include after-school tutoring, community service events and field trips for grade-school students and career planning assistance for high-school students.

Island Walk After School Support Program (IWP)**Community Preservation & Dev. Corp****Region 3**

The program provides intensive literacy support, English Language Support, and academic and homework assistance to the residents of the Island Walk Affordable Housing Community located in Reston, VA. A new element being added is a Postsecondary Homework Support Program in response to community feedback. The new program will serve IWP high school graduates who utilized IWP and Island Walk adult residents who are attending college for the first time. IWP is collaborating with NVCC's Adult Career Pathways Program.

Homeless Youth Initiative**Alternative House****Regions 1, 2, 3, 4**

The Homeless Youth Initiative program provides rental assistance and other supportive services to youth enrolled in Fairfax County high schools that are identified as homeless and do not have the support of a parent or guardian. The program will use one of three strategies to provide safe and appropriate shelter for these teens: 1) provide rental subsidies to help the teens pay for a room near their school, 2) place them in one of the six "HOST" homes that shelter students at no charge or 3) place student in a single family home that provides shelter for up to four students. The program will also provide case management, life skills training and educational support services to the target population.

Northern Virginia Pro Bono Law Center**Fairfax Law Foundation****Regions 1, 2, 3, 4**

The program provides access to free civil legal services to poverty and low-income individuals and families in order to enable them to attain self-sufficiency. The Center will continue to address the problem of limited pro bono legal resources for the underserved by identifying, recruiting, and training volunteer lawyers to assist in critical legal areas. The program will also provide access to legal services (from brief advice and counsel to court appearances) to improve and maintain individual and family health and stability, emphasizing domestic relations, housing, employment and consumer law.

Stable Long-Term Housing for Chronically Homeless Adults**New Hope Housing, Inc.****Region 1**

The program will provide flexible and adoptive supportive services to assist chronically homeless individuals and families obtain, manage and maintain stable housing, increase life skills, build financial resources and address disabling conditions.

Workforce Development Center

United Community Ministries

Region 1

The program proposes to provide job counseling and job placement services to unemployed and under-employed individuals through its Workforce Development Center. Services will include basic computer skills training; workplace readiness skills training, English as a Second Language (ESL) for work and job placement. The program proposes to add two new vocational training components to focus on culinary arts and customer service.

Children's Program

AYUDA

Regions 2, 3

AYUDA proposes to provide legal and social services to immigrant children. Services will include legal advice and counsel, representation in related immigration, protection order, and family law matters. In addition, youth will receive clinical case management, social services supports and other short-term intervention activities such as securing emergency shelter, assistance in accessing transitional housing and emergency help, referrals of counseling and medical care, ESL and computer classes, job training programs, etc.

Adult Career Pathways

Northern Virginia Community College Educational Foundation

Regions 1, 2, 3, 4

The program proposes to serve unemployed/under-employed workers, work eligible immigrants with strong English skills and entry level career students that have obtained a high school diploma or GED. The program will connect participants with career counselors/coaches who will assist them in developing an education or training plan to earn a college degree, certification or other credential that may help them to qualify for and secure employment with a path toward advancement and greater economic security.

Case Management

Lamb Center, The

Regions 1, 2, 3, 4

The Lamb Center is a Day Drop-In Center for homeless single adults. The center provides case management, food and personal hygiene services on a daily basis. Various counseling services, job placement assistance and subsidized transportation cost are also offered once basic needs are met.

Training Futures

Northern Virginia Family Service (NVFS)

Regions 1, 2, 3, 4

The program provides low income clients intensive job training and readiness skills along with a unique psychosocial support component. Each 25 week program cycle consists of 17 weeks of intensive office/computer skills training, 3 weeks of skills application in an internship with a local company and 5 weeks of job search training and skills marketing. Training includes MS Office, keyboarding, internet skills, business-oriented math, communication and soft skills associated with finding and retaining employment. The program also developed a collaborative partnership with Northern Virginia Community College, where clients have the opportunity to gain up to 18 college credits for their work.

Assistive Technology Program: Supporting Fairfax County Residents with a Brain Injury

Brain Injury Services

Regions 1, 2, 3, 4

The proposal seeks funding to design and initiate an assistive technology program for survivors of brain injury that will to overcome barriers in the workplace, home and community leading to

independence. Assistive technology as defined by BIS is any piece of equipment that helps individuals with disabilities, move, communicate or otherwise function in their daily lives.

**Cedar Ridge Community Center
Reston Interfaith, Inc.
Region 3**

The program will provide for the continued operation of a residents' center located in a subsidized housing community. The center will offering programs for adults and youth intended to: develop community and family leadership, strengthen academic and life skills, prevent homelessness and juvenile delinquency and provide information and referrals.

**Legal Assistance for Immigrants-Employment
Legal Aid Justice Center
Regions 1, 2, 3, 4**

The program provides legal assistance, education and advocacy to assist low wage immigrant workers in preserving their rights in the workplace. Specifically, the program provides: free legal assistance, including consultation and advice; assistance with court proceedings; assistance with and monitoring of the filing of complaints with the Virginia Department of Labor and Industry; or extended legal representation including trial in state or federal court. The program will continue to conduct regular outreach to low-wage immigrant workers in an effort to educate them about workers' rights, the legal system and where to get assistance.

**Pathways to Self-Sufficiency
Pathway Homes, Inc.
Regions 1, 2, 3, 4**

Pathway Homes, Inc. serves high-risk individuals that face the challenges of chronic homelessness, serious mental illness and/or co-occurring disabilities. The program will provide intensive case management services to assist these individuals in maintaining stability in the community and reach self-sufficiency. The program's main goal is to integrate these individuals into the community and to provide non-time limited housing services.

**Fairfax Accessible Medication Program
Northern Virginia Family Service (NVFS)
Regions 1, 2**

The program links low income clients who have chronic illnesses to pharmaceutical assistance programs (PAPS) operated by the pharmaceutical companies to obtain free prescription medication.

**HIV/AIDS Prevention Education for Youth
Northern Virginia AIDS Ministry
Regions 1, 2, 3, 4**

The program will provide targeted, comprehensive and specialized HIV prevention education programs to county youth. NOVAM will provide HIV prevention education across the county in schools, juvenile detention, group homes, and other community sites.

**Screen, Treat, Educate, Program (STEP)
Jeanie Schmidt Free Clinic
Regions 3, 4**

The program provides comprehensive, no cost primary healthcare to low-income, uninsured residents of the Centreville, Chantilly, Herndon and Reston areas of Fairfax County. Adult patients, who must have a diagnosis of diabetes and/or hypertension, receive comprehensive primary healthcare from paid and volunteer medical and behavioral health professionals, supplemented by other community partners. For its pediatric patients, the program enrolls, assesses, stabilizes and treats clients while ensuring enrollment into a long-term pediatric medical home.

Pathways Long Term Supportive Services**Pathway Homes, Inc.****Regions 1, 2, 3, 4**

The program provides long-term supportive services to high-risk individuals that face the challenges of chronic homelessness, serious mental illness and/or co-occurring disabilities. The program will provide non-time limited housing, case management and intensive supportive services. The program's main goal is to integrate these individuals into the community and normalize their lives as much as possible.

Building for the Future**Wesley Housing Dev. Corp.****Region 2**

The program provides quality pre-kindergarten, after-school enrichment for children and teens and summer enrichment services at two culturally diverse, low-income communities. In addition to providing academic assistance for at-risk children and teens, the proposed project will provide a safe place to engage in social and life skills building activities.

Education for Independence**ACE Foundation****Regions 1, 2, 3, 4**

The program proposes to provide workforce development training to low-income single parents, single pregnant women and displaced homemakers. Program activities will include career development workshops, technical job skills training, job readiness training and educational counseling and support services.

Beth El House**Beth El House, Inc.****Region 1**

Beth El House provides transitional housing and support services to up to five single mothers and their children for up to two years. The family is placed in apartments and provided with a cadre of support services including case management, clinical counseling, skills development and budgeting assistance.

Crisis Intervention**Lorton Community Action Center****Region 1**

The program offers emergency food and financial assistance for rent and utility bills, seasonal holiday assistance and information/referral services.

Self-Sufficiency through Health, Housing & Social Services**Vietnamese Resettlement Association****Regions 1, 2, 3, 4**

The program provides assistance to low-income Asians with limited English at its drop-in center in the Willston Center. The assistance includes preventative health care (mammograms and cervical cancer screening), individualized case management and assistance in locating/applying for affordable housing options.

Community Case Management Program**Shelter House, Inc.****Regions 1, 2, 3, 4**

The program helps vulnerable clients develop a plan for housing stability and increased self-sufficiency as well as accessing financial assistance and linking clients with available community supports. Prevention & Diversion services will be provided through access to HOST- Short Term, HPRP and Bridging Affordability funds. Additionally, case managers will provide 6 to 12 months of

rapid re-housing services to clients exiting the Patrick Henry, Katherine Hanley and Artemis House shelters.

SkillSource- Sheriff Employment Center

SkillSource Group, Inc.

Regions 1, 2, 3, 4

The SkillSource Group provides employment counseling to inmates that are incarcerated at the Fairfax County Jail who are preparing to re-enter the community and the workforce. The organization will assist inmates with job search, resume development, GED preparation and other supportive services. Additionally, the program will work with area employers to identify and place inmates into various employment opportunities.

Service for Crises Intervention & Self Sufficiency Program

James Mott Community Assistance Program

Region 4

The program provides financial assistance for rent and utilities, emergency food, weekly food distributions and transportation to low income individuals /families. In addition, the program would like to expand services to include monthly workshops on topics such as nutrition, budget planning, and resume writing; and employment counseling to promote self-sufficiency.

Padres Unidos & Parent Cafes

SCAN of No. VA

Regions 1, 2

The program proposes to provided parent support group sessions and parent café workshops to low income Spanish speaking parents. A facilitator for the Padres Unidos component of the program will provide educational materials for weekly sessions based on the parents' needs. The parent café workshop series will include a trained facilitator who will offer a four-part educational workshop series at Mount Vernon pyramid schools. Topics will include Understanding Roles and Responsibilities for Family Members, Effective Communication, etc. The goal of the program is improve adult-child relationships within their household.

Crisis Intervention & Self-Sufficiency

Northern Virginia Family Service (NVFS)

Regions 1, 2

The program proposes to provide crisis intervention and self-sufficiency services to individuals living in Fairfax County. Activities include information and referrals, case management, immigration assistance, financial counseling and employment counseling services.

NOVA Restorative Dental Clinic

Northern Virginia Community College Educational Foundation

Regions 1, 4

NVCC Restorative Dental Clinic proposes to provide affordable dental services to uninsured residents of Northern Virginia. Services will include routine dental care, dental treatment planning and emergency dental services.

Emergency Services/Supportive Housing

FACETS

Regions 1, 2, 3, 4

This program offers homeless and shelter/transitional housing residents intensive case management (individual action planning), basic needs assistance (hot meals, food and clothing) and services to increase self-sufficiency (computer access, transportation and referrals).

**Seniors Specialist Program; Supporting Fairfax County Residents with a Brain Injury
Brain Injury Services**

Regions 1, 2, 4

The program proposes to provide specialized case management services to older adults with brain injuries, including information, referrals, education programs and long-term rehab support services to maximize recovery and re-integration back to the community.

Access to Self Sufficiency through Extensive Training and Services (ASSETS)

Business Development Assistance Group, Inc.

Regions 1, 2, 3, 4

This project involves providing assistance and training for those who want to become self-sufficient through business ownership. Services include educational programs and technical assistance including one-on-one counseling, self-employment training and/or provision of resource information/referrals.

Medical Transportation Support Services

Northern Virginia AIDS Ministry

Regions 1, 2, 3, 4

The program will provide assisted transportation for low-income individuals living with HIV/AIDS who do not have an insurance subsidy, access to a vehicle or reliable transportation. These services will be used to assist clients to medical and other social service appointments in order to help them meet their ongoing basic life needs and improve their ability to be safe and independent by ensuring their access to community facilities, activities and services.

Adult Health Direct Assistance

Northern Virginia Family Service (NVFS)

Regions 1, 2

The program provides assistance to adults in need of urgent dental care. The goal of the program is to link low-income adults with private dental care professionals and other available resources. Clients will receive an average of \$75 in assistance to assure prompt evaluation and treatment planning resulting in improved health status, enhanced stability and self-sufficiency.

Long Term Supportive Services

Lorton Community Action Center

Region 1

The program will offer food, clothing, furniture/household items, medical and prescription assistance, seasonal holiday assistance and direct financial assistance (rent/utility) to elderly and disabled residents of the Lorton area. Clients served under this program can receive financial assistance more frequently and at a higher amount than is capable under the organization's Crisis Intervention program.

Camp Shalom

Jewish Community Center of No. VA

Regions 1, 2, 3, 4

The program collaborates with the Jewish Social Service Agency (JSSA) to offer a camp for children with special needs in grades 1-6. The children served are ages 6 to 12 with significant social communication problems such as Autism Spectrum Disorders, Down Syndrome, and Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD). The camp offers four two-week sessions, grouped according to age, which include social skills workshops, field trips, swimming, specialty inclusion classes and other social enrichment activities.

Mental Health Resource Project
Korean Community Service Center of Greater Washington
Regions 1, 2, 3, 4

The program provides a comprehensive range of culturally and linguistically appropriate direct services that help Korean clients improve their mental health status. Program activities include mental health resource building & outreach efforts, case management, short-term counseling and crisis intervention services. Case management is designed to include referrals to support groups and interpretation/ translation services in order to improve clients' overall mental health status.

Refugee Self-Sufficiency Program
Lutheran Social Services of NCA
Regions 1, 2, 4

The program proposes to provide intensive case management and employment services to low-income refugee families with unemployed heads of households who are at-risk of homelessness. The program will assist families in securing permanent housing and finding employment.

Case Management/Housing Counseling
Housing & Community Service of No. VA
Regions 1, 2, 4

The program provides short and long-term housing counseling and case management to assist low income families in managing their crisis and achieve self-sufficiency. The program will also provide housing search assistance, financial literacy, and emergency financial assistance to prevent eviction or utility cut-off.

Homes for the Homeless Transition Housing Program
Christian Relief Services, Inc.
Regions 1, 2, 3, 4

The program provides supportive services and case management to tenants of transitional housing units throughout the county. Case management is provided by Christian Relief Services or by a sponsoring agency and is provided to help clients progress towards self-sufficiency and permanent housing.

Fairfax Resource Mothers
Northern Virginia Urban League
Regions 1, 2, 3, 4

The program proposes to provide case management and parenting training to teenage mothers and pregnant teens that reside in Fairfax County. The program will assist the teens in scheduling and maintaining pre-natal visits, well-baby checkups and family planning appointments. Additionally, the program will provide transportation for the teens to ensure that they attend all of their medical and social service appointments.

Promising Futures
Wesley Housing Dev. Corp.
Region 2

This project will provide eviction prevention services, job-readiness programming (ESOL classes & GED preparation) and family & consumer science education (financial literacy, nutrition education and sewing skills) to residents living at Wexford Manor and Strawbridge Square apartment communities.

Nutrition/Hygiene
Annandale Christian Community for Action (ACCA)
Region 2

The program operates on the grounds of the Child Development Center in Annandale and is operated entirely by volunteers who stock shelves, purchase supplemental food, deliver food and serve as "food captains." They receive electronic referrals from Fairfax County's Coordinated Service Planning

workers and other referral sources. A volunteer then picks up food from the pantry and delivers a 7-10 day supply of food to the client.

Emergency Assistance

Falls Church Community Service Council, Inc.

Region 2

The Emergency Assistance program provides financial assistance for rent and utilities, prescription payments, gas, transportation, etc. and basic furnishings for clients in the Falls Church area. Short-term financial assistance is offered to families and individuals having financial difficulties. The voucher program provides clothing vouchers at Goodwill stores which allows clients to receive appropriate clothing to meet their need. Furniture is delivered to households leaving shelter or transitional housing programs. Referrals for services are received from social workers, churches and the county's CSP.

Home Delivered Food & Nutrition Counseling

Food & Friends

Regions 1, 2, 3, 4

The program proposes to provide home delivered meals and groceries to people living in Fairfax County who are identified with life-challenging illnesses, such as HIV/AIDS and cancer.

Housing for Homeless Families

Homestretch, Inc.

Regions 1, 2, 3, 4

The program will provide subsidized housing and support services (case management, employment counseling and budget counseling, life skills training, child enrichment and community service links) to homeless families.

Child Abuse Intervention & Treatment

Childhelp Children's Center of Virginia

Regions 1, 2, 3, 4

In response to allegations of child abuse, the program proposes to provide crisis intervention services in a safe, child friendly environment. Services will include forensic interviews, victim advocacy counseling, referrals for community supports and services, mental health therapy, education and supports for victims and non-offending parents/caretakers and trauma informed therapy. Staff will work with the Fairfax County Police Department, Department of Family Services, Fairfax/Falls Church Community Services Board, Office of the Commonwealth Attorney of Fairfax County, Inova Fairfax hospital for Child and Hispanics Against Child Abuse and Neglect.

Adult ESL & Citizenship Program

Progreso Hispano

Region 1

The program proposes to provide ESL and citizenship classes to immigrants, refugees and migrants through its Adult ESL & Citizenship program. The ESL component will offer beginner through advanced English classes twice a week during the day and as well as in the evenings. The goal is to develop English literacy skills to improve speaking, reading, writing and an understanding of the English language. The citizenship component will offer citizenship classes, exam preparation, and assistance with application process. In addition to ESL and citizenship classes, the program will operate a computer lab with online ESL courses, practice exams for citizenship, employment search, employment applications and the social media.

Lifestyles for People with Disabilities**Community Residencies, Inc.****Region 2**

Community Residences proposes to continue its wellness program for clients with disabilities who reside at its housing site called "Parliament House." The program will facilitate behavioral changes through individualized goal setting, active goal implementation, nutrition education, physical exercise and group support. CCFP funds will be used to help transition individuals into a living environment that affords greater independence and responsibility.

Bilingual Housing Rehabilitation Specialist**Town of Herndon****Region 3**

This project will provide technical support, program administration, design and outreach for housing rehabilitation and neighborhood improvement in the Town of Herndon. The population addressed is lower income residents and the limited English speaking population.

ADDRESS - Aggressive Dynamic Debt Reduction Elimination & Savings Strategies**Homestretch, Inc.****Regions 1, 2, 3, 4**

This program provides financial management education, budget and credit counseling, debt reduction and savings assistance, with on-site child care, for homeless residents in order to help them become self-sufficient.

Connections for Hope/HOST Region 3**Helping Children Worldwide****Region 3**

The program is a partnership of nonprofit organizations that operate in one central location to provide individuals and families in need with access to an integrated array of services in the Herndon area. Services included through partner agencies include: mental health and substance abuse services (CSB), youth and adult medical care (Jeanie Schmidt), immigration services (Just Neighbors), adult tutoring and ESOL services (Literacy Council), and Homeless Prevention and Re-Housing Program (Reston Interfaith). The North County Housing Opportunities Support Team (HOST) will be located at the center to coordinate Fairfax County's "Ten Year Plan" response to prevent and end homelessness.

Living Independently for Tomorrow (LIFT)**Residential Youth Services, Inc.****Regions 1, 2, 3, 4**

RYS, Inc. proposes to provide transitional housing services to homeless and "at-risk" youth between the ages of 17-21. The program will serve runaway youth as well as youth who are aging out of the foster care system. Staff will provide supportive services including life skills training, goal setting and linkages to community resources (i.e. Medicaid, mental health, and employment counseling).
