


## LEVERAGING

Fairfax County tax dollars leveraged community capacity to serve county residents. For every \$1 provided through the Consolidated Community Funding Pool, another \$4.19 in cash, donated goods, services and volunteer time was leveraged by community based organizations to support these projects. Over 31,662 persons provided more than 397,000 hours of volunteer services.



## PLANNING AND OVERSIGHT

The Consolidated Community Funding Advisory Committee, with additional input from county residents, plans for and recommends funding pool policy and funding priorities for approval by the Fairfax County Board of Supervisors. Membership on the committee includes 17 representatives from County Human Services Boards, Authorities and Commissions, business groups, schools, and the United Way. The County Executive appoints a citizen Selection Advisory Committee to review and recommend all proposal awards for Board of Supervisors approval.

The **FAIRFAX COUNTY CONSOLIDATED COMMUNITY FUNDING POOL** provided \$10,366,365 for 115 community and housing projects. A total of 71 nonprofit organizations received these competitive and outcome-based awards for the first year of the FY 2007-2008 funding cycle.

## THE IMPACTS...

(Duplicated Count)

### Priority 1 – Self-Sufficiency Families and individuals, including seniors and persons with disabilities, are healthy, stable, and independent

- ▶ 34,383 people were linked or referred to needed services and resources
- ▶ 6,520 persons obtained medical treatment or were matched with primary care providers
- ▶ 998 individuals received dental care
- ▶ 271 persons received mental health and treatment services
- ▶ 1,035 non-English speaking persons improved basic English skills
- ▶ 1,405 individuals were provided with transportation to access community resources
- ▶ 4,859 people had their legal issues resolved
- ▶ 7,145 families and individuals moved toward independence or remained stable
- ▶ 2,005 persons improved employment skills
- ▶ 1,290 individuals obtained employment/increased income
- ▶ 94 parents received childcare service

### Priority 2 – Affordable Housing Families and individuals, including seniors and persons with disabilities, have a home

- ▶ 375 individuals placed in affordable housing
- ▶ 1,617 persons improved their housing situation
- ▶ 5,988 people maintained housing
- ▶ 120 housing units were rehabilitated in low-income communities

### Priority 3 – Youth Youth have knowledge, skills and abilities to make safe responsible decisions

- ▶ 4,002 youth reduced at-risk behaviors
- ▶ 862 youth improved academic performance


### Priority 4 – Basic Needs Families and individuals, including seniors and persons with disabilities, meet their basic needs

- ▶ 56,361 emergency basic needs were addressed
- ▶ 7,319 crises were stabilized

During Fiscal Year 2007 over 81,000 persons in 46,000 households (aggregate totals) throughout Fairfax County benefited from *Consolidated Community Funding Pool* projects.
