Community Garden Renovation

The renovation project installed new paths and garden plots. The garden plots are small, manageable areas adopted by residents and neighborhood groups. These groups have the responsibility to maintain their plots. The plants are all native, in keeping with an Resource Protection Area (RPA) garden. Also, the foot paths were heavily mulched and edged to keep the mulch in place and better direct foot traffic. An existing garden space was renovated to remove introduced and invasive species to allow for planting of native trees, shrubs and perennials offering year-round interest as well as attracting both larvae and adult phases of butterflies. In addition, significant grading corrections were completed and wood-chip paths installed.



The Parklawn Pool – Recycled Park for the People intends to literally recycle existing, overgrown tennis courts into a desirable local park and to enhance the association’s recruitment effort. Additionally, the project will rebuild an abandoned shelter, to serve as the hub of the park. For phase 1 of the project, the community accomplished the following items:

- Demolition and recycling of metal fences
- Demolition of the fence foundations (partial haulaway)
- Demolition of the light poles
- Demolition of a stairway and storage bunker
- Removal of weed trees and vines growing over the tennis court

Burke/West Springfield Center Without Walls

The purpose of the project was to develop, implement and connect the older adult community in Glen Cove to a network of community-based and faith-based organizations and individuals providing physical fitness activities. In order to achieve this goal, the network needed funding for the development of website and marketing materials, funding for fitness instructors, and funding for a trained facilitator who will assist the various groups to develop a framework for the organization. The principal tasks for this grant were the development of a community information web site and to provide exercise classes to promote physical well-being for all interested seniors in the area. The web site is now up and running at scwow.org, and is being maintained by volunteers from the Center Without Walls (CWOW) organization. The exercise classes were announced in January by the CWOW and rapidly filled up with over 350 individuals enrolled in the winter session and now have a mailing list of over 450. There were six offerings as identified on the web site conducted at the Woods Community Center in Burke and the Lord of Life Lutheran Church in Fairfax.
