On October 19, 2015, Bryan Porter, the Commonwealth’s Attorney, David Lord, the Senior Assistant Commonwealth’s Attorney, Marc Birnbaum and James Entas, the Assistant Attorneys General, CHARLES STANARD SEVERANCE, the Defendant, and Megan Thomas and Christopher Leibig, Counsel for the Defendant, appeared before this Court. The Defendant is indicted for the felonies of CAPITAL MURDER (Counts 1 & 5), USING A FIREARM IN THE COMMISSION OF A FELONY (Counts 2, 4, 6, and 8), MALICIOUS WOUNDING (Count 3), FIRST DEGREE MURDER (Count 7), POSSESSION OF A FIREARM BY A CONVICTED FELON (Counts 9 and 10) and he appeared while in custody.

Counsel for the Defendant advised the Court that Joseph King, Counsel for the Defendant, was unable to appear this date and moved the Court to instruct the Jury regarding his absence. Counsel for the Defendant stated they were prepared to proceed with trial today. The Court then addressed a matter raised by a juror, without objection by Counsel.

The roll call was taken and the jurors took their place in the Jury Box. The Court advised the Jury regarding the absence of Mr.King.


The Defendant, in person, moved the Court to continue this case. The Jury was excluded from the courtroom and Counsel conferred with the Defendant.

Counsel for the Defendant then moved the Court to continue this case, which motion the Court, after hearing argument, **granted**.

The Jury was recalled. The Court **ORDERED** that this case be continued to **October 20, 2015 at 10:00 a.m.** and the jurors were excused.

The Defendant was remanded to the custody of the Sheriff.
