<sup>1</sup> In order to account for revenues and expenditures in the proper fiscal year, audit adjustments in the amount of \$690.35 have been reflected as an increase to FY 2004 revenues. These adjustments have been included in the FY 2004 Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (CAFR). Details of the FY 2004 audit adjustments are included in the FY 2005 Third Quarter Package.

<sup>2</sup> It should be noted that in the Fall of 1988 a Commercial and Development Bond Referendum was approved, of which \$9.7 million was designated for the redevelopment of the Woodley-Nightingale mobile home park. An amount of \$6.37 million remains authorized but unissued for this project.

<sup>3</sup> Capital projects are budgeted based on the total project costs. Most projects span multiple years, from design to construction completion. Therefore, funding for capital projects is carried forward each fiscal year, and ending balances fluctuate, reflecting the carryover of these funds.
