<sup>1</sup> FY 2007 HOME funding projections include a set-aside of at least 15 percent, \$441,308, mandated under HOME regulations, from the County's total HOME allocation for eligible Community Housing Development Organizations (CHDOs), up to a 10 percent set-aside of \$241,264 for administrative expenses as permitted under HOME regulations (including \$21,928 for the Fair Housing Program), a planning factor of \$720,059 for Tenant-Based Rental Assistance, \$44,751 for the American Dream Initiative, and \$1,010,005 for affordable housing projects approved by the Fairfax County Redevelopment and Housing Authority (FCRHA) and the Board of Supervisors.

<sup>2</sup> Capital projects are budgeted based on the total project costs. Most projects span multiple years, from design to construction completion. Therefore, funding for capital projects is carried forward each fiscal year, and ending balances fluctuate, reflecting the carryover of these funds.
