**From I-66:** Take Exit 55B onto the Fairfax County Parkway (Route 286) North; turn right onto Fair Lakes Parkway (east); turn right at light onto Monument Drive; turn right onto Government Center Parkway. The Government Center is on your left.

**From Route 50:** Take the exit for West Ox Rd. (Route 608) South; turn left at light onto Monument Drive (east); turn right onto Government Center Parkway. The Government Center is on your left.

**From Fairfax City (Route 29 South):** Turn right at the light at Forum Drive; turn left at the light onto Government Center Parkway. The Government Center is on your right.

**From Centreville (Route 29 North):** Turn left at the light at Forum Drive; turn left at the light onto Government Center Parkway. The Government Center is on your right.



- **ASSIGNMENTS:** Following most meetings, students will be given a short assignment. These assignments must be completed and provided to the program teacher coordinator. Students will be required to present their knowledge of local government to 8th grade civics classes near the conclusion of the program.

- **ATTENDANCE:** Students may have only **one** absence from monthly meetings during the year to qualify for graduation.

- **INTERNSHIPS:** Students participating in the Youth Leadership Program will work a three-week summer internship in County offices. For their service, the students receive a \$1,000 payment. During these internships, student interns will be expected to arrive promptly at work each day, complete work assignments, and wear suitable attire for a business office setting. Please note the dates of the internship requirement directly conflict with the Governor's School Program.

- **TRANSPORTATION:** Students are responsible for arranging transportation to monthly meetings and to the summer internship assignment. Most internship assignments are located at the Government Center complex or nearby.

- **CANCELLATION OF MEETINGS:** If for any reason (such as inclement weather) afternoon activities are cancelled by Fairfax County Public Schools, then the Youth Leadership Program meeting scheduled that day will also be cancelled.
