DVPPCC Call for Nominations

The Fairfax County Domestic Violence Prevention, Policy and Coordinating Council (DVPPCC) is seeking passionate and dynamic community leaders.

The mission of the DVPPCC is to **unite** senior-level public officials and community leaders; to **advise** the Board of Supervisors on a range of domestic violence policy, legislative, and program issues; and to **guide** the development of a coordinated and collaborative community response to domestic violence in Fairfax County.

The DVPPCC recognizes an effective and coordinated response to domestic violence requires collaboration across the entire community, at all levels. To achieve this coordinated response, an ongoing commitment and consistent participation from our leaders, partners, and community is integral to our planning and response efforts.

The DVPPCC currently has three (3) membership vacancies to complete a three-year term on the council (the current term will end January 2016, with an option of unlimited subsequent terms).

The leaders will represent Fairfax County and the following specific populations:

1. Representative, housing provider
2. Representative, marginalized and/or underserved populations
3. At-large Representative

Appointed DVPPCC members are expected to participate actively and consistently (including attendance at all quarterly meetings) in the accomplishment of the following council goals:

- Engage the community in a collective response to the prevention and intervention of domestic violence.
- Support victim safety and autonomy and promote offender accountability and an opportunity for offenders to eliminate violent behavior in all forms.
- Increase coordination and consistency of system and community interventions and service provision.
- Advise the Board of Supervisors on policy and legislative priorities for improving the county's response to domestic violence.

To achieve these goals, the Council works closely with the Fairfax County Domestic Violence Network (which is comprised of service providers and justice professionals), the Domestic Violence Fatality Review Team (DVFRT) and the Domestic Violence Action Center (DVAC) project partners.
