Request for Qualifications
B/B2 Raw Wastewater Pump Stations Rehabilitation

THE COUNTY OF FAIRFAX, VIRGINIA, Department of Public Works and Environmental Services is soliciting statements of qualifications from engineering firms to provide professional engineering services for the evaluation of two raw wastewater pump stations and related processes and systems located at the Noman M. Cole Jr., Pollution Control Plant, an advanced wastewater treatment plant, with an average daily flow of 67 million gallons per day (MGD), located at 9399 Richmond Highway, Lorton, Virginia. Upon the completion of the evaluation phase, the County reserves the option to ask the selected firm to provide the full design and services during construction.

Consultants who wish to be considered for this work must submit eight (8) hard copies of their statements of qualifications and one compact disc containing the submission in PDF format to:

The Statement of Qualifications must include:

1. Statement of Interest
2. GSA Standard Form 330 for the primary firm and all major sub consultants
3. List of references with current addresses and telephone numbers for similar work in comparable pollution control plants (with average daily flows of greater than 40 MGD)

All submissions must be complete and clearly document the capability and experience on similar projects for large wastewater treatment plants. A Selection Advisory Committee (SAC) will evaluate firms on the following criteria:

1. Ability and experience of team (prime and subs) to deliver work as described
2. Project manager's qualifications and experience
3. Project team's other key personnel qualifications and experience
4. Capacity to perform the work considering the firm's current and projected workload
5. Performance history on similar projects in terms of effective cost control, quality assurance/quality control, and schedule performance

The SAC will short-list firms, conduct interviews, and make a selection recommendation to the Deputy Director of the Department of Public Works and Environmental Services. Short-listed firms will be invited to present and discuss their qualifications and approach towards the project. A detailed scope of work will be provided to the short-listed firms prior to the interview.

All Statement of Qualifications shall be delivered no later than 4:00 p.m., local prevailing time on Friday, June 5, 2015. Statement of Qualifications received after this date and time will not be considered. The Statement of Qualifications shall not exceed twenty-five (25) double-sided or fifty (50) single-sided sheets including the GSA Standard Form 330.

Fairfax County is committed to protecting the environment. As such, Statements of Qualifications must be made of paper product only to allow recycling. Fairfax County is also committed to paying a living wage to all qualified County employees and encourages contractors and subcontractors involved in all County programs, services, and activities to pay a living wage to their employees.
