## BUILDING LASTING INFRASTRUCTURE

Whether constructing new buildings, roads and trails or improving the county's stormwater and wastewater infrastructure, DPWES continually strives to demonstrate the highest standards of efficiency, service and environmental stewardship with each project.



Providing a wide variety of services to residents and customers in Fairfax County, DPWES core services are:

- **CAPITAL FACILITIES** plans, designs and builds county buildings and revitalizes commercial and residential neighborhoods
- **LAND DEVELOPMENT SERVICES** guides development in the county to meet all safety and health standards and assists residents with planning decks and major home improvements
- **SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT** ensures the environmentally-responsible disposal and recycling of more than one million tons of trash generated in the county each year
- **STORMWATER MANAGEMENT** controls polluted run-off from roofs, roads and other hard surfaces which protects public safety, preserves property values and supports environmental initiatives
- **WASTEWATER MANAGEMENT** protects public health and improves water quality by collecting and treating wastewater
- **URBAN FOREST MANAGEMENT** promotes tree planting and preservation in land development and works to control gypsy moth, fall cankerworm and emerald ash borer from threatening the trees in the county
