WHAT IS A CESQG?

Businesses that generate **less than 100 kilograms (220.46 lbs. or 27 gallons) of hazardous waste per calendar month** are called Conditionally Exempt Small Quantity Generators or CESQGs.

Businesses can also qualify as CESQGs if they produce **less than one kilogram (2.2 lbs. or 1/4 of a gallon) of acutely hazardous waste per calendar month**. The most common CESQGs in Fairfax County are county agencies, schools, universities, non-profit organizations, places of worship, print shops, auto repair shops, household painting businesses, building contractors, manufacturing firms, landscape contractors and nurseries, property management companies, funeral homes, and exterminators.

WHAT IS THE FAIRFAX COUNTY CESQG PROGRAM?

The Fairfax County CESQG Program provides businesses with an economical way to manage small quantities of hazardous waste. CESQGs often have difficulty with disposing of small quantities of hazardous waste. Hazardous waste companies usually have a minimum amount of waste they will pick up or charge a minimum fee for service. Typically, the minimum fee exceeds the cost of disposal for hazardous waste. This leaves the small quantity generator in a difficult situation.

Our charges are based on the amount of material to be disposed of and include all consolidating, packaging, manifest paperwork, and shipping preparations. Payment is due upon arrival.

Visa, MasterCard, checks or cash are accepted. Make checks payable to Director of Finance, Fairfax County.

HOW CAN MY BUSINESS PARTICIPATE?

Any small business in Fairfax County (including businesses in cities and towns within Fairfax County) that qualifies as a CESQG may participate in one of the six disposal events scheduled in 2016.

Bring your hazardous waste to the I-66 Transfer Station from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. on a CESQG disposal day. We are not able to accept waste on days other than the scheduled event dates.

When you arrive, we will determine if you qualify for the program based on the types and amounts of waste you generate.

You must show proof that your business is located in Fairfax County by providing a copy of your business, personal property, state, or county license.

A waiver must be signed and notarized certifying that your business is located in Fairfax County and generates less than 100 kilograms (220.46 lbs.) of hazardous waste per month and/or less than 1 kg (2.2 pounds) of acutely toxic ("P"- listed) waste per calendar month.

Please note that non-hazardous waste such as latex paint does not count against your generation status. There is no limit to the amount of non-hazardous waste you can dispose of. Waste must be in five-gallon containers or smaller, with lids. All containers must be labeled for identification.
