FAIRFAX COUNTY FIRE & RESCUE

+ Public facilities, including police, fire & rescue and library facilities are part of a network of services and functions provided by the Fairfax County government. These facilities are essential to support the community and enhance overall quality of life. The county's present system of public facilities demonstrates a high commitment to service provision and the community's expectations. As part of current policy, a balance between future land use and facility quantity and location is considered to maximize accessibility and provide timely responses while minimizing neighborhood impact.

The Fairfax County public library system provides a network of facilities and library services to meet the educational, recreational, and informational needs of residents. The library system is composed of two categories of libraries, regional and community, based on facility size and the extent of services provided.




FAIRFAX COUNTY FIRE & RESCUE DEPARTMENT

Emergency response coverage along the Richmond Highway study area is provided by the Penn Daw Fire and Rescue Station 11 and the Woodlawn Fire and Rescue Station 24. Both stations have exceeded their life cycle and funding has been approved to expand or replace these facilities. The new facilities will have the flexibility and capacity to add Fire and Rescue personnel and apparatus to keep pace with the potential increased demand for emergency services resulting from future development in the study area. Estimated timing for improvements is between five to seven years.



FAIRFAX COUNTY POLICE DEPARTMENT

Currently, the Mount Vernon Police Station is the primary facility serving the study area. The facility, originally built in 1982, was renovated in 2003. There are no immediate improvements being considered. In November 2015, a South County Police Station/ Animal Shelter was approved. There are three sites being considered for its location, all within the Laurel Hill area. Once a location is selected, patrol realignments will be considered.
