

Transportation: Transit

General Information

Bus Transit

- » The Fairfax Center Area is served by Fairfax Connector Bus 600 Series and Metrobus 1C, 2B, and 2G.
- » Most of the bus routes serving Western Fairfax County run primarily during morning and afternoon peak periods, bringing riders to the Vienna Metrorail Station and Reston Town Center.
- » Park-and-Ride facilities are situated along major bus routes to facilitate efficient use of bus transit. Commuter lots in the Fairfax Center Area include the Stringfellow Road Lot (385 spaces) and the Government Center Lot (170 spaces).

I-66 Multimodal Study

- » A Tier-One Environmental Impact Study was recently completed by the Virginia Department of Transportation and the Virginia Department of Rail and Public Transportation. Its main purpose was to improve multi-modal mobility along I-66 by providing diverse travel choices. These choices included Metrorail, Bus Rapid Transit, and High-Occupancy Toll (HOT) Lanes. This is an on-going study, with the Record of Decision for Tier-One anticipated in October-November 2013.

Pedestrian and Bicycle Transit

- » The Fairfax Center Area is well-suited for nonmotorized transportation, with its close proximity of different land uses and access to transit and commuter facilities.
- » Several multiuse paths along main thoroughfares link pedestrians and bicyclists to local amenities.
- » The county is developing a Countywide Bicycle Master Plan that will recommend improvements to the existing transportation system.
