



Spring Hill Farm, built circa 1822, was one of the largest surviving examples in Fairfax County of an early-nineteenth-century farmhouse. It was unfortunately demolished in 2013 due to disrepair. The owners of the property and house have had significant roles in the history of Fairfax County. These include the Fairfax family, the Scott and Alexander families, the Swink family, and the Alvord family. While it was no longer a working farm, Spring Hill Farm was an island of preserved rural land in the midst of the Washington suburbs, maintaining the character of a historic landscape that once characterized Fairfax County.
