**Small Group Questions**

1. In thinking about Reston in the future, the Working Draft text takes the approach that new residential growth will be focused in transit station areas and Village Centers while neighborhoods generally are unchanged. *(up to 30 minutes)*
  - a) Is this approach in line with the future you envision for Reston's residential neighborhoods?
  - b) **If yes**, why do you think it's important to keep the residential areas basically unchanged?
  - c) **If no**, what alternative would you suggest?
  
2. Similarly, the Working Draft text has taken the approach that new commercial growth will be focused in transit station areas and Village Centers while the convenience centers (including proposed Baron Cameron Avenue convenience center) generally stay the same. *(up to 30 minutes)*
  - a) Is this approach in line with the future you envision for Reston's commercial areas?
  - b) **If yes**, why do you think it's important to keep these commercial areas basically unchanged?
  - c) **If no**, what alternative would you suggest?
  
3. Several themes emerged from feedback received at the June Phase 2 Open House. These included preserving green space, improving pedestrian and bicycle connectivity, increasing affordable housing in Reston, and addressing congestion. *(15 minutes; additional time if available)*
  - a) Are there other themes/ideas that you have not heard mentioned today that you think should be considered as part of this process?
