

Joan M. DuBois was elected to serve as the Dranesville District Supervisor in November 2003. Joan represents the Board of Supervisors on the Board of Directors of the Dulles Area Transportation Association (DATA), and is a member of the County's Agricultural and Forestal District Advisory Committee. She is a member of the Metropolitan Washington Council of Governments (COG) Board of Directors, the Aviation Policy Committee, the National Capital Region Emergency Preparedness Council, and is an alternate voting member on the National Capital Region Transportation Board (TPB). She also serves on the Northern Virginia Regional Commission and the Board of Directors of the Virginia Association of Counties.

Prior to her election, Joan was a member of the Fairfax County Planning Commission. She served on the Commission's Environment Committee, Redevelopment and Housing Committee, and Parks Committee, and chaired the Capital Improvement Program Committee. She also served as a member of the following countywide committees and commissions: Revitalization Policy Committee, Civil Service Commission, Minority Upward Mobility and Retention Task Force, and Co-Chairman of the Fairfax County Chamber of Commerce Planning and Land Use Committee.

Joan's community involvement has included: President of Kent Gardens Elementary School PTA, Chairman of the McLean Community Center Governing Board, Dranesville District Comprehensive Land Use and Policy Plan Amendment Task Forces, and board member and numerous committee activities with the McLean Citizens Association.

The McLean Community Center (MCC) was built and is funded by residents of Greater McLean for their use through a real estate tax surcharge, the result of a 1970 bond referendum (Small District 1A-Dranesville). An eleven-member Governing Board, elected by citizens of the District and appointed by the Fairfax County Board of Supervisors, oversees the Center's budget and operation. MCC offers a continuing program of activities for adults and children, including a wide range of classes, lectures, study tours, camps, art exhibits, theatre performances, and specialty shows. The MCC also operates a teen program at the Old Firehouse in downtown McLean.

Board members are elected for four-year terms. The Board establishes county government policy, passes resolutions and ordinances, approves the budget, sets local tax rates, approves land use plans, and makes appointments to various positions.

School Board

The Fairfax County School Board is charged by the statutes of Virginia and the regulations of the Virginia Board of Education to provide and operate the public schools of Fairfax County. The twelve School Board members are elected for four-year terms; one member represents each of the county's nine magisterial (election) districts, and three members serve at large. The Board holds business meetings at 7 p.m. twice monthly in the Board Room at Jackson Middle School, 3020 Gallows Road, Falls Church. Members of the community are invited and encouraged to attend public meetings of the School Board to observe its deliberations.
