**Code Compliance Corner**

*Multiple Dwellings*

Section 2-501 of the Zoning Ordinance limits the number of dwelling units allowed on a residential lot to one. If you notice any activity in your neighborhood related to multiple occupancy, too many people, an excessive number of vehicles, separate entrances on a house, or more than one kitchen at a home on a residential property, you may contact the Department of Code Compliance (DCC) to file a complaint.

## **2017 Reduced Cost Rabies Clinics**

### *Fairfax County Animal Shelter*

Virginia law requires all dogs and cats more than four months old to be vaccinated for rabies and have their vaccinations up to date. The Fairfax County Animal Shelter will offer rabies vaccinations at the reduced rate of \$15 per pet.

Dogs, cats, and ferrets will be vaccinated at these clinics. Dogs must be on leashes and cats and ferrets must be in carriers. Only cash and checks will be accepted. 2017 County Dog Licenses will be sold for an additional cost of \$10.
