

**Synopsis of Events Related to the Storm on June 29, 2012
Fairfax County Human Services**

- Provided Human Service coverage at the EOC for multiple operational periods.
- Coordinated with other agencies and volunteer organizations to proactively protect special needs populations.
- Planned for potential sheltering of residents from homeless shelters affected by the storm. Coordinated with OPEH hoteling for displaced homeless shelter residents.
- Assisted in identifying and prioritizing critical facilities for electrical power restoration; monitored progress of those facilities and reported them to HS leadership.
- Staffed Transportation Call Center until 6 p.m. on Wednesday, July 4.
- Coordinated general HS related requests such as generators for senior facilities; volunteer drivers.
- Arranged for food vouchers and generator fuel for Lockwood/Elmwood Senior apartments.
- Coordinated motel placements, meals and transportation for Lewinsville Senior Residences.
- Provided Giant gift cards for 50 people at Lockwood House.
- Utilized a hypothermia site (Cameron Glen HS bldg.) to shelter adult residents of Embry Rucker homeless shelter.
- Assisted one additional family with emergency food vouchers and was prepared to provide same assistance to other families not being able to be helped by traditional means, especially during the July 4 holiday.
- Assisted with the opening of a heat relief center in a McLean area church.
- On-the-street staff helped confirm whether power had been restored in key facilities and acted as the liaison for homeless shelters operated by CBOs.
