Intersection and Sidewalk Pedestrian Improvements**

Find out about the proposed pedestrian improvements along Richmond Highway (US Route 1).

**Proposed pedestrian access and bus stop improvements at Route 1 intersections:**

- Lukens Lane
- Ladson Lane
- Frye Road
- Belford Drive (south)
- Mohawk Lane

**Proposed sidewalks along Route 1 northbound:**

- Reddick Avenue to across from Martha Street
- Across from Belford Drive (south) to Kings Village Road
- Kings Village Road to Woodlawn Trail
- Across from Belleview Avenue to Quander Road

**Proposed sidewalks along Route 1 southbound:**

- Sacramento Drive to Engleside Plaza (north of Woodlawn Court)
- Sky View Drive to 200 feet south
- Along Belle Haven Towers Frontage (between Fairhaven Avenue and Mount Eagle Drive)

If a request for public hearing is received, notice of the date, time and place of the hearing will be posted.

The project was coordinated through the State Environmental review process and no impacts to environmental resources were identified.
