Do you know the emergency phone number? Check that your family does, too!


Now you're ready. IT'S TIME TO PRACTICE YOUR PLAN!!!!

## General Fire Safety Survey:

1. The house address is clearly posted in large numbers that are easy to read from the street.

2. There is a working smoke alarm near the sleeping areas. \_\_\_\_\_ Yes/No
3. There is a working smoke alarm on every level of the house. \_\_\_\_\_ Yes/No
4. The smoke alarm is cleaned regularly and tested once a month. \_\_\_\_\_ Yes/No
5. You know the emergency telephone number for fire and rescue (9-1-1 in Fairfax County.)  
\_\_\_\_\_ Yes/No
6. This number is posted on all telephones for immediate reference. \_\_\_\_\_ Yes/No
7. You have portable fire extinguishers suitable for use in your home and family members know how to use them properly. (Multi-purpose extinguishers are recommended.) \_\_\_\_\_ Yes/No
8. You have a family escape plan and practice it regularly. \_\_\_\_\_ Yes/No

If any of the answers above are "No," sit down as a family and discuss the problem and how it can be corrected. Take this opportunity to consider fire safety awareness with your family, and at the same time, make your home a safer place to life.
