




29	30	<p style="text-align: center;">Lyme Disease Symptoms</p> <p>The first sign of infection is usually a circular rash called erythema migraines that begins at the site of the tick bite after a delay of three to thirty days and gradually expands over the period of several days, resulting in a bull's eye appearance. Patients also experience fatigue, chills, fever, headache, muscle and joint aches, and swollen lymph nodes. If untreated, the infection may spread to other parts of the body producing an array of discreet symptoms including loss of muscle tone on one or both sides of the face, severe headaches and neck stiffness, shooting pains, heart palpitations, dizziness, and pain that moves from joint to joint. After several months, approximately 60% of patients with untreated infection will begin to have intermittent bouts of arthritis with severe joint pain and swelling and up to 5% of untreated patients may develop chronic neurological complaints months to years after infection.</p>
