



Our Challenge

Threats of severe temperatures and lack of affordable housing.

That is what close to 3,000 children, women and men face.

- 30% of all persons who were homeless were children.
- 9% of single adults who were homeless were reported as veterans.
- 58% of all adults in families who are homeless are employed, yet still cannot afford a stable home in this area.
- A person needs 3.7 jobs paying minimum wage to afford a two-bedroom apartment in Fairfax County.

Despite common misconception, the majority of the chronically homeless *do* want a safe and stable place to live, but they are often unable to remain in a permanent home without support services or financial help?
