- Authorized advertisement of public hearing scheduled before the Planning Commission on February 20, 2008 at 8:15 PM and proposed Board of Supervisors' public hearing on March 10, 2008 at 4:00 PM to update roadways and roadways list by functional classification in Appendix 8 as part of Comprehensive Plan Amendment No. 2003 P-08.
- Authorized advertisement of a Public Hearing on an Uncodified Ordinance that will provide for up to a **one dollar taxicab fuel surcharge** until October 31, 2008 for proposed hearing before the Board of Supervisors for January 28, 2008 at 4:00 PM.
- **Adopted Board of Supervisors' Meeting Schedule for Calendar Year 2008;** (www.fairfaxcounty.gov/government/board/bdagenda/schedule.htm)
- Adopted a Resolution approving the **Economic Development Issuance of Revenue Bonds** in the amount of \$10,000,000 to assist Ennstone, Inc. in the financing of industrial facilities.

Action Items

- **Supervisor Hudgins** was reappointed along with former Board members, and new Board members were appointed, for a four-year term to the **Fairfax County Solid Waste Authority**.
- **Approved the allocation of the contributed road funds from the Tysons Fund Area for transportation improvements identified by the Comprehensive Plan and the Tysons Land Use Task Force (Providence and Hunter Mill Districts):** for a maximum of \$8.1 million allocations. Projects include: 1) Extending Boone Blvd. east and west from its current location and extend Greensboro Drive west from its current location, 2) conceptual design and engineering for Rt 7 from Rt 123 to the Capital Beltway, to develop a design of Rt. 7 consisted with streetscape associated with reconstruction of Rt 7 as part of the Dulles Corridor Metrorail Project, and 3) Additional funds to further the prioritized transportation

improvements recommended by the Tysons Land Use Task Force when they are made. The remaining funds will be encumbered, but set aside to conduct various feasibility, engineering and design, and traffic studies to implement the prioritized list of projects. Funding currently available is \$8.1 million. This action will encumber \$8.1 million of the \$13.7 million available in the fund. The remaining \$5.6 million was proffered for specific projects and is not available for allocation.

Board Matters

- Board Matter requesting that **South Lakes High School Principal Bruce Butler** and **Vienna resident Howard Springsteen** be recognized before the Board of Supervisors for being named **Citizens of the Year by the Fairfax County Times for Reston and Vienna** respectively.
- Board Matter asking that **Bruce Wright**, member and former chairman of the county's **Trails and Sidewalks Committee** and current president of **Fairfax Advocates for Better Bicycling (FABB)** be recognized before the Board.
- Board Matter asking that Dulles Corridor Metrorail Project and County staff coordinate carefully on **utility relocations on Route 7** to avoid possible interference with pedestrian walkways.

3:30 PM: Approved the vacation, abandonment, and discontinuance of portions of **Centreville Road (Route 657)** that was previously a portion of the former alignment of Centreville Road.

4:30 PM: Approved **SEA 76-C-152-04 (Exxon Mobil Corporation)** to amend **SE 76-C-152** to increase the size of the quick-service food store from 1,431 square feet to 3, 250 square feet and construct a new car wash to replace the existing car wash, located on approximately 1.07 acres located at 1818 Wiehle Avenue, Tax Map 17-4 ((5)) Parcel 4.

4:30 PM: Held a public hearing to obtain citizen input for the Department of Community and Recreation Services' Grant Application to the Commonwealth of Virginia for funding under the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) Section 5310 Program for **three FASTRAN wheelchair lift-equipped replacement vehicles**.

5:00 PM: Deferred - Decision Only on January 28, 2008 for **PRC B-846 (JBG/RIC Retail LLC, JBG/RIC LLC)** to approve the **PRC Plan** associated

with **DP B-846** to permit high density residential, minor commercial and office service center development, located on approximately 9.96 acres zoned PRC.

5:00 PM: Approval of PCA 2003-HM-046-02 (Woodland Park Crossing Retail, L.L.C.) to amend the proffers for RZ 2003-HM-046 previously approved for mixed use development to permit flexibility in the mix and location of uses and associated modifications to site design with an overall floor area ration of 0.70 located on approximately 5.66 acres zoned PDC – at the intersection of Sunrise Valley Drive and Woodland Pointe Avenue, Tax Map 16-4 ((23)), Parcel C.
