**PRESENTATIONS** sponsored by Supervisor Hudgins:

The Board recognized **Laurie and Jack Corkey** for their contributions, the 20th anniversary of their Great Harvest Bread Co. stores in Herndon and Vienna and their retirement. The Corkeys have participated in special occasions for Boy Scout and Girl Scout troops; the Fairfax County Council of the Arts; the Juvenile and Diabetes Research Foundation; the Giving Circle of Hope; and the Elden Street Players.

## **ADMINISTRATIVE ITEMS**

**Admin 3: Authorized to advertise a public hearing to expand the Reston Community Parking District.** Board approved advertisement of a public hearing on April 27, 2010, at 4:30 p.m. An expansion has been requested to add additional streets to the already established Large Area Reston CPD to include the areas western border of Reston (Tax District 5) along Fox Mill Road southbound from the intersection with Monroe Street, along southbound Lawyers Road to northbound West Ox Road to the Monroe Street/Fox Mill Road intersection.

**Admin 4: Authorized to advertise a public hearing to consider amending Fairfax County Code Section 82-5A (Residential Permit Parking Districts) related to fines.** Board authorized advertisement of a public hearing for April 27, 2010, at 4:00 p.m., to consider a proposed amendment to increase Residential Permit Parking District (RPPD) parking violation fines (from \$40 to \$50) and also to clarify permit eligibility requirements.

**Admin 5: Authorized to advertise a public hearing to consider amending Fairfax County Code Section 82-5B (Community Parking Districts) related to fines.** Board authorized advertisement of a public hearing for April 27, 2010, at 4:00 p.m., to consider a proposed amendment to increase Community Parking District (CPD) parking violation fines (from \$40 - \$50).

**Admin 8: Approval of Supplemental Appropriation Resolution AS 10135 for the Department of Family Services to accept grant funding on behalf of the Northern Virginia Workforce Investment Board from the Virginia Community College System for the Workforce Investment Act Dislocated Worker Program.** Supplemental appropriation of \$383,249 from the Virginia Community College System for the Workforce Investment Act (WIA) Dislocated Worker program, accepted on behalf of the Northern Virginia Workforce Investment Board to supplement existing stimulus grant. No local cash match / no new positions created. Services provided to dislocated workers include: assessments of participant skill sets and strengths, career guidance, job search assistance, labor market information, employer referrals, and training services targeted toward matching clients' employment opportunities with labor market demand.

**Admin 9: Authorization to advertise the proposed Planning Commission public hearing on April 21, 2010 @ 8:15 p.m., and the proposed Board public hearing on May 25, 2010 @ 4:30 p.m. on a proposed Zoning Ordinance amendment re: establishment of Planned Tysons Corner Urban District (PTC) – to implement the Comprehensive Plan recommendations proposed for the Tysons Corner Urban Center.**

## **ACTION ITEMS**

**Action 1: Approval of Fiscal Year 2010 Forest Pest Management Suppression for the following:** Gypsy Moth, Fall Cankerworm, Emerald Ash Borer and Hemlock Woolly Adelgid. The Code of the County of Fairfax, Virginia requires the submission of the annual Integrated Pest Management Program for the Board of Supervisors' approval. Fiscal Impact: Forest Pest Program is funded through the Special Service District for the Control of Forest Pests. The total amount budgeted for FY2010 for aerial and ground treatments is sufficient for this suppression program.

**Action 4: Approval of a Waste Trade Agreement between Fairfax County and Fauquier County** to ship minor amounts of construction and demolition debris from Fairfax County to Fauquier County, and that the County receives at the I-66 Transfer station in exchange for equal value of combustible waste from Fauquier County to be burned at the I-95 Energy/Resource Recovery Facility. There would be no additional cost to either County for this exchange.

**Action 5: Adoption of a resolution to endorse the Metropolitan Washington Council of Government's Greater Washington 2050 Compact.** The Board voted to continue its support of regional planning and cooperation and adopt the proposed resolution in support of the Metropolitan Washington Council of Government's "Greater Washington 2050 Compact." <http://www.mwcog.org/>

**Action 6: Amendments to financing documents between the Lorton Arts Foundation (LAF) and Fairfax County** to begin Phase II infrastructure improvements required in accordance with their original business plan. LAF seeks to extend the County's credit support for Phase I to the Phase II improvements.

## **INFORMATION ITEMS**

**Info 3: Contract Award – Urban Land Institute (ULI) Consulting Services: Five-Day Advisory Services Panel Program** for advisory services to ensure that the older commercial areas are planned appropriately to accommodate future growth in a way that best utilizes available land and assets. Fiscal Impact: \$120,000 per assignment with the anticipated frequency of service once every two (2) years, depending on the need.

## **BOARD MATTERS** introduced by Supervisor Hudgins

**Girl Power:** I requested the Board of Supervisors proclaim May 22, 2010, **Girl Power Day in Fairfax County**, and invite representatives for Girl Power to come before the Board on May 11<sup>th</sup> to be recognized for their dedication to such a worthwhile organization that benefits the young women in our community.

**TANF Emergency Contingency Fund:** I requested that the Board of Supervisors send a letter to our Congressional delegation alerting them to the County's use of Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF) emergency fund, request that they support proposed legislation to extend funding for an additional year, and work to move it accordingly. The ECF has been used to support jobs in 21 states and DC, particularly for populations with high unemployment rates and great need. This includes summer jobs programs for low-income youth and programs that help participants enter the labor market as they gain experience and connect with employers.

**Tax Relief Workshops:** The Office of Public Affairs is requested to advertise two planned Tax Relief Workshops in the Hunter Mill District on Friday, April 23 at the Reston Community Center, and Wednesday, April 28 at the Vienna Community Center.

**Skate Park On Wheels:** Supervisor Hudgins and the Town of Vienna are co-sponsoring a Skate Park on Wheels, Saturday, April 3, from 2 to 5 p.m. at the Vienna Volunteer Fire Department on Center Street in Vienna. This free event is open to all.
