7-13-2010 Board Action Highlights

Below are excerpts from the **July 13, 2010 Board of Supervisors** meeting that may be of interest to you as a Hunter Mill District constituent. PRESENTATIONS sponsored by Supervisor Hudgins

Ben Peck, one of the founders of Frying Pan Farm Park and long time volunteer was recognized for his over 50 years of service to the park and Fairfax County. Ben was instrumental in the early preservation of the former farmland that is now the park and has taken an active role in the park's development and programs for many years.

ADMINISTRATIVE ITEMS

Admin 11: Authorization to advertise a public hearing on amendments to the Code of the County of Fairfax, Chapter 82, Motor Vehicles and Traffic, Section 82-4-10, Maximum Speed Limits. Board action is requested to provide sufficient time to advertise the proposed hearing on September 14, 2010, at 4:30 p.m. to advertise a public hearing to consider amending Chapter 82, Motor Vehicles and Traffic of the Code of the County of Fairfax, Virginia, dealing with maximum speed limits in posted zones. To ensure that violations of Virginia Code Section 46.2-878 - exceeding posted speed limits - can be charged under the County ordinance, it is proposed that Section 82-4-10 be amended and readopted with language incorporated from Section 46.2-878.

Admin 12: Authorization for the Department of Family Services to apply for and accept grant funding from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services for Second Year of the Early Head Start Program.

- \$662,532 for the second year of the Early Head Start expansion
- DFS received funding for the first year of the Early Head Start expansion through the American Reinvestment and Recovery Act of 2009 (ARRA)

- Required 20 percent local match will be met through \$50,000 in Local Cash Match from Fund 102

Admin 14: Streets into the Secondary System (Hunter Mill District)

Additions to the State Secondary System.

TST Woodland LLC Subdivision

Monroe Street – Route 666
(Additional Right-of-Way Only)

Admin 15: Authorization for the Department of Transportation to Apply For and Accept Funding for the National Infrastructure Investment Program (TIGER II) Funds; and Support for the Regional TIGER II Application. The total County requests equal \$78.0 million, including the U.S. Route 29/Gallows Road Intersection Improvements (\$20.0 million); the Springfield Central Business District (CBD) Multimodal Transportation Facility (\$35.0 million); the Vienna Ramp Project (\$22.0 million); and the Richmond Highway Transit Study (\$1.0 million). There is a 20 percent Local Cash Match required for these grants, should they be received.

Board also supported the Regional Bike Sharing and Bike Access Program application being submitted by the Council of Governments (COG)/Transportation Planning Board (TPB). After TIGER II allocations have been determined, staff will return to the Board for concurrence with specific grant agreements for projects administered by Fairfax County.

ACTION ITEMS

Action 1: Approval of 2010 Zoning Ordinance Amendment Work Program. Board approved the amendment as recommended by the Development Process committee. Request for amendments originated from the BOS, Planning Commission, Board of Zoning Appeals, staff, citizens, and industry representatives. Action Item 2: Board approval of the list of authorized underwriters for potential future negotiated bond sales. Actual fiscal impact of each bond issue will be assessed at the time of financing approval by the Board of Supervisors. No fiscal impact at this time.

Action Item 3: Changes to the Fairfax County Purchasing Resolution. Four of ten bills enacted into law by 2010 General Assembly either modified a mandatory section of the Virginia Public Procurement Act (VPPA) or included changes recommended by staff. No fiscal impact.

INFORMATION ITEMS

Info 2: Contract Award - Fairfax County Parkway/West Ox Road Intersection Improvement (Sully and Hunter Mill Districts). This project provides for construction

of a dual left-turn lane northbound to West Ox Road and an extension of the existing southbound right-turn lane to West Ox Road. This project is included in the FY 2011 – FY 2015 Adopted Capital Improvement Program.

Info 3: Contract Award – West Ox Animal Shelter Renovation and Expansion

\$11,200,000 project: lowest bid for the shelter is 9.2% below the initial estimate for this project.

Info 4: Contract Award – Pharmacy Services & Pharmaceuticals

In December, the Department of Purchasing issued RFP for prescription medications for clients of the CSB. Notice was sent to approximately 220 firms, with four responding. Contract award to QoL Meds, a company that is dedicated to providing pharmacy services to mental health consumer being serviced in community mental health centers throughout the United States. Discounted pricing including a match of the Wal-Mart published \$4.00 30-day supply and \$10.00 90-day supply prices for generic medications. Five year contract with three (3) one-year renewal options, total estimated amount of this contract is \$10 million.

Info 5: Contract award to American Contracting and Environmental Services, Inc.

for the construction of Tertiary Clarifier Rehabilitation at the Noman M. Cole, Jr. Pollution Control Plant renovations, Project X00911, Fund 408, Sewer Bond Construction.

Director of the newly created Department of Neighborhood and Community Services (NCS) is announced. The County Executive announced the appointment of **Christopher Leonard** as the director of NCS. The new department consolidates the Department of Community and Recreation Services and the Department of systems Management for Human Services. Chris will assume his new position on July 19th.

BOARD MATTERS

Joint BOS/Town Council of Vienna Meeting: Board of Supervisors request staff work with Vienna Mayor Jane Seeman to find an opportunity for a joint meeting of the Vienna Town Council and the Fairfax County Board in the near future. The Town Council and the Board of Supervisors share many common areas of interest and the opportunity to jointly meet to discuss those issues can only benefit the citizens we represent.

Hunter Mill District Community Softball Game: On August 18th the Hunter Mill District will sponsor a community softball game beginning at 6:00 p.m. at the South Lakes High School baseball field in Reston. The game will feature WPGC - 95.5 against the Fairfax County Police Department's Road Dawgs. Soft drinks and food from the grill will be provided. Residents are encouraged to come out to enjoy the game, meet radio personalities, and get to know some of the police officers and County staff.

National Night Out is coming up on August 3rd: On this night, Fairfax County residents are asked to turn on their porch lights and come outside to join with their neighbors and local police in a variety of activities. Representatives from the Fairfax County Police Department will come before the Board at our July 27th meeting to receive a proclamation encouraging all Fairfax to participate in the National Night Out.

Legal Assistance to Northern Virginia Transportation Commission: Board authorized the Office of the County Attorney to provide legal assistance to the Northern Virginia Transportation Commission when requested by NVTC.

PUBLIC HEARINGS

4:00 Public Hearing on proposed Amendments to Article 1 of Chapter 61 (Building Provisions) of The Code of the County of Fairfax, Virginia, Re; Property Maintenance to transfer property maintenance responsibilities from the Director of Department of Planning and Zoning and the Building Official with the Department of Public Works and Environmental Services or designee to the newly created Department of Code Compliance (DCC). DCC will assume responsibility for enforcing the Virginia Maintenance Code for existing residential buildings and structures and existing nonresidential buildings and structures in Fairfax County.

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
