Dear Hunter Mill Friends,

We had a jam-packed meeting on Tuesday. Along with numerous administrative and action items, we made several significant decisions. We approved the Memorandum of Understanding with our Dulles Rail partners on Phase 2 funding, saving an estimated \$757 million in fees for Dulles Toll Road users. We acted on the recommendations of the Consumer Protection Commission and approved amendments to the County Code establishing exclusive service areas and maximum rates, fees and charges for water service. Our 2012 legislative program outlining our priorities for the Virginia General Assembly and 112th Congress was approved. (You can review the entire [legislative program report](#) on-line.) We also heard testimony from several residents expressing their views on the County's archery program for deer management.

Lawrence V. Fowler Award: **Marlene Blum** was selected to receive the 2011 Lawrence Fowler Award, recognizing longstanding volunteer service to a County board, authority, commission or committee. Marlene has served on the Health Care Advisory Board since 1985.

ADMINISTRATIVE ITEMS

Admin 8: Streets accepted into the secondary street system

Cameron at Woodland Park – Centreville Road (Route 657) (additional ROW only)

Sunrise Valley Drive – (additional ROW only)

Dulles Tech LC – Coppermine Road (additional ROW only).

Admin 10: Authorization to advertise a Planning Commission public hearing for January 18, 2012 and Board of Supervisors public hearing on February 28, 2012, to amend Chapter 7 (Streets, Parking and Driveways) of the Public Facilities Manual to address issues related to the new procedures for installation of street lights and use of mercury vapor lights. Dominion Power will coordinate the street light installation directly with the County in new developments. Also deletes the option to use mercury vapor lights for new installations, in accordance with federal energy policies.

Admin 11: Authorization to advertise a public hearing on January 24, 2012 to consider changes to The Code of County of Fairfax, Chapter 82 – Motor Vehicles and Traffic, Article 5, Sections 32 through 32.2. Concerns removal and disposition of vehicles unlawfully parked on private or County property by tow operators. Changes include:

- Signage designating towing area posted at every entrance
- Tow operators must take pictures showing the reason for the tow and vehicle before towing
- Tow operators must accept cash, credit cards and debit cards as forms of payment
- Towed vehicles will be immediately available for release at the request of the owner.

Admin 12: Extension of the review period for AT&T Mobility Corporation (FSA-H97-35-2) – antenna colocation on existing monopole at 11400 South Lakes Drive, Reston to February 19, 2012.

Admin 16: Authorization to advertise a public hearing on January 10, 2012, to consider amendments to Chapter 62 (Fire Protection) of the County Code. Changes are recommended to strengthen our local fire prevention regulations.

Admin 17: Authorization to advertise a Planning Commission public hearing on January 26, 2012 and Boar of Supervisors hearing on February 28, 2012, to amend the Zoning Ordinance regarding independent living facilities for low income residents and modifications of the administration provisions of the Affordable Dwelling Unit Program and to the definitions of "Dwelling Unit" and "Independent Living Facility. Creates an independent living facility use for low income residents with handicaps/disabilities and/or who are 62 years of age and older.

Admin 19: Authorization to advertise a public hearing on January 10, 2012 to consider adopting an ordinance to establish the Polo Field Residential Permit Parking District. Staff recommends adoption of this Residential Permit Parking District.

Admin 22: Supplemental Appropriation Resolution AS 12069 for various County agencies to accept Department of Homeland Security Urban Areas Security Initiative Subgrant Awards from the government of the District of Columbia Homeland Security and Emergency Management Agency. Funds in the amount of \$13,132,418 to be used to enhance capabilities in emergency management, police, fire service and communications. Continues funding of 4 existing grant positions.

Admin 24: Authorization for the Fairfax County Fire and Rescue Department to apply for and accept funding from the 2010 State Homeland Security Grant through the United States Department of Homeland Security. State funding of \$100,000 recommended to be used to purchase a large box truck to respond to heavy tactical and technical rescue events.

ACTION ITEMS

Action 1: Approval of a memorandum of understanding between the Board of Supervisors and Clean Fairfax Council Incorporated to extend the current agreement. Extends the current agreement that support litter abatement education and coordination of volunteer litter cleanups across the County.

Action 2 & 3: Authorization to execute an agreement for sale and use of reclaimed water from the Noman Cole Jr. Pollution Control Plant. Approved a water reuse agreement with Laurel Hill Golf Course and South County Little League baseball fields for irrigation.

Action 7: Adjustment to the Fairfax Center Road fund contribution rate and authorization of corresponding rate adjustment in the Centreville and Tysons Corner Fund areas. The Contribution Rate has been adjusted for inflation (Consumer Price Index). This will increased the funds contributed by developers to the Contributed Roadway Fund for off-site road improvements by approximately 3.89%.

Action 8: Approval of the Third Amendment to the Master Agreement with the Virginia Department of Rail and Public Transportation for funding of transportation demand management outreach in the Fairfax County Department of Transportation (FCDOT). Agreement provides FCDOT with funding to continue its outreach programs aimed at reducing the number of single-occupancy vehicles on the roads.

Action 9: Results of Tysons Metrorail Station Access Management Study (TMSAMS) Public Outreach efforts and Referral of the TMSAMS report to staff. FCDOT will evaluate the detail in costs, feasibility and right of way impacts of the priorities established in the public outreach efforts and from the TMSAMS Advisory Group, and report back to the Board in the spring with recommendations for implementation.

Action 10: Approval of Memorandum of Agreement concerning Phase 2 of the Dulles Corridor Metrorail Project. Board approved the memorandum of agreement among United States Department of Transportation, Commonwealth of Virginia, Fairfax County, Loudoun County, Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority, and Metropolitan Washington Airports Authority.

Action 11: Endorsement of the Chief Administrative Officers Task Force's recommendations regarding the preliminary FY 2013 Virginia Railway Express Budget. The task force recommended a three percent jurisdictional subsidy increase and three percent fare increase to help VRE produce a balanced budget for FY 2013.

Tysons Metrorail Station Access Management Study (TMSAMS) Priorities: Cost estimates on the projects will be provided for their incorporation in the first Quarterly Four Year Transportation Plan report of 2012.

INFORMATION ITEMS

Info 3: Contract award – Countywide Transit Network Study (Countywide). For the development of a framework for discussion of cultivating a vision for a Countywide, connected transit network and to draft an outline for a potential Countywide transit study.

Info 7: Make it Work Program for Students with Disabilities. The County will partner with Fairfax County Public Schools to provide job opportunities and job training to students and graduates with disabilities.

PUBLIC HEARINGS

4:00 Public hearing regarding Chapter 65 County Code Amendment for establishment of exclusive service area and maximum allowable rates, fees and charges for water service. The Board approved the recommendations of the Fairfax County Consumer Protection Commission amending the Code to allow the County to fix rates and charges for water services provided to customers in the County and establish Fairfax Water as the exclusive water service provider for new development in the County.

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
