3-20-2012 Board Action Highlights

Below are excerpts from the **March 20, 2012 Board of Supervisors** meeting that may be of interest to you as a Hunter Mill District constituent. PRESENTATIONS

Marshall Road Elementary: 50th Anniversary. Principal Jennifer Heiges and PTA President Beth Eachus attended today's meeting along with Hunter Mill School Board representative Pat Hynes to receive a proclamation on their 50th anniversary and recognition of the school's **50 for 50** service projects.

County Executive Anthony H. Griffin was presented with Leadership Fairfax's 2012 Katherine K. Hanley Public Service Award.

ACTION ITEMS

Action 1: Approval of a resolution to authorize the sale of Fairfax County Economic Development Authority Facilities Revenue bonds for the Woodburn Replacement Center Project and the Providence Community Center Project.

Woodburn Replacement Center Project: Replaces the existing Woodburn Mental Health Center and consolidates other CSB programs from various leased spaces. Estimated cost of construction: \$86.5 million.

Providence Community Center: Two story structure partially funded by a proffer with Pulte – Metro West project. To be completed in fall 2013. Estimated cost: \$13.1 million total, County's share - \$6.5 million.

Action 2: Authorization for the Fairfax County Redevelopment and Housing Authority to loan up to \$2,725,900 to Pathway Homes, Inc., for the purchase of thirteen scattered site condominium, townhouse and single family units. Federal Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) and HOME Investment Partnership Program funds will be loaned to Pathway Homes, Inc. for the acquisition of housing units to serve income-eligible persons with multiple disabilities.

INFORMATION ITEMS

Info 6: Waste delivery disposal agreement with the District of Columbia to extend the existing agreement through the period of time that the County currently controls access to the Energy/Resource Recovery Facility (E/RRF) to maximize the potential benefit to both parties. The proposed agreement extends the District's access to the E/RRF through December 2015 and increases its potential use to up to 250,000 tons per year. This will allow the County to continue to utilize all available capacity in the Facility resulting in a lower average cost for processing waste at the Facility.

PUBLIC HEARINGS

4:30 p.m. Public Hearing on PRC A-502-02 Fairways I Residential, L.L.C. and Fairways II Residential, L.L.C to redevelop 18 existing 3-story apartment buildings containing 348 multifamily units with 804 residential units with a mix of townhomes and multifamily units. Decision was deferred until April 10, 2012 at 3 p.m.

5:00 p.m. Public hearing on the confirmation of Fairfax County's participation in Phase Two of the Dulles Metrorail Project. The Board deferred action on the decision until their next meeting on April 10, 2012.

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
